Pastor's Page December 2022

Advent is the beginning of a new Church Year. It is not too far removed from the New Year, a time in which we often re-

flect on the past, and look toward the future.

There has been a lot of talk about the future of the Church, big "C" church, and the ELCA. Over the past year, there have been conversations within Grace about our present and future: people asking about new members; about our children and youth ministry; our Strategic Planning team asking good questions about Worship, Congregational Support, Discipleship and Learning, Parish Life, and Outreach & Social Ministry. Things are different in the Church than they were 50, even 20 years ago, and we know it. To ask about where Grace, or the big "C" Church is headed feels pretty mysterious these days.

Richard Rohr, a Franciscan author on spirituality, encourages us to trust in the mystery of our faith: *"it is no* accident that the liturgy has at its core, a statement of faith that repeats, **I believe**, **I believe**. Regardless of what it is, we must find our real belief system. What are we passionate and enthusiastic about? What are we filled with God about?"

These are Advent questions and are not easy ones! There are a lot of things in our present day that we have questions about, and it seems these days that almost everyone can identify what is wrong with our nation and world. Again Richard Rohr speaks powerfully to our present day: "Being reactionary against what's wrong might excite people, but it does not convert anybody, does not transform anybody, and does not draw the soul. We all know what's wrong, we all know what should be changed, but more change, no matter how progressive, will not bring about soul transformation in and of itself. *Our call to change is now obviously*

much deeper."

Rohr continues: "Our faith also offers us a foundational belief that life is a succession of dyings and risings. At the center of the Eucharist, we proclaim, "Christ has died, Christ is risen, and Christ will come again." That is the saving pattern! It is not a mystery of faith; it is the mystery of faith. It will never change. But Western people, trained in the philosophy of progress and problem-solving don't really believe that anymore. We much more believe that we can overcome the paschal mystery. That we can create a family, a parish, a church, an institution, a country that will not have to go through the dying of things." 1

Martin Luther in his Small Catechism answers - to the question of what our Baptism means for daily life - that every day we die to sin and death through repentance, and every day a new person rises up to live before God. This is at the foundation of who we are as children of God. It is the pattern that Jesus created for us.

In a few short weeks we will celebrate Jesus' birth in a manger. The pattern of all the gospels is the movement of the gospel toward the cross, to death on that cross, and then Jesus' rising from the dead to new life. We enter into that mystery once again, that God so loved the world to send his only Son. There is such joy to receive Jesus into our lives! At the same time we are called to enter into a change in direction (repentance), when our lives, our neighborhoods, our church, our nation, are called into that same process of dying and rising. Stir up your power and come, O Christ! Renew our passion and enthusiasm, fill us with your love, so vour will is done on earth as it is in heaven! Or, as Martin Luther writes in his beautiful Christmas hymn: Ah, dearest Jesus, Holy Child, make Thee a bed, soft, undefiled within my heart that it may be, a quiet chamber kept for Thee. Amen.

Highlights of Congregation Council November 15, 2022

Highlight of Church Council November 15, 2022

- Ron Almarode reported a \$19,000 surplus in the budget. He also reported that Grace received \$32,000 in increased pledges for 2023.
- Congregational Meeting is scheduled for December 11th to approve the budget.
- WARM Cold Weather Shelter is scheduled for December 5-11 and for January 23-30. Volunteers are needed on all days but especially Friday, December 9th, Saturday, December 10th and Sunday, December 11th. Grace will be collecting toiletries and breakfast and snack food items.
- Our refugee family has received their vehicle. The family is now waiting to take the written test which has been delayed twice by the DMV.
- Reminder that the Council person of the week is responsible for the phone messages on Friday and Saturday.
- There will be a new pictorial directory coming in 2023. Carolyn Hite will oversee this project with Jack Eckstrom being the photographer.
- Embrace needs winter clothes for youth such as coats, scarves, hats and gloves as well as sweaters and pants.
- The Christmas Eve services will be held at 5 pm and 8 pm. The Christmas Day service will be at 10 am. December 18th has been scheduled to decorate the church after the service.
- The Christmas Giving Tree is in the nave. Unwrapped gifts are to be brought back by December 4th.
- College care packages will be assembled on November 27th. Those wishing to donate are asked to bring snacks, microwavable popcorn, hot chocolate, etc. to the church.
- Advent begins on November 27th. Wednesday Advent services will be shared by the four Lutheran congregations St. James Lutheran Church, Zion Lutheran Church, Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church and Bethlehem Lutheran Church.

- **Overnight Hosts**: 2 volunteers/night; assist the Staff Host overnight (in-person OR by telephone); in morning, make coffee and put out breakfast items and sack lunches, Clean up after.
- **Clean-up Team**: light cleaning duties. WARM will have guests complete basic chores (sweeping, mopping if needed, removing garbage). We will come in during the day (after the guests are gone,) to check the area, follow-up as needed Lysol bathrooms, showers; wash/dry/fold towels.
