## From the Pastor

### Pastor's Page –

*For by Grace you have been saved, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God – not the result of works, so that no one may*

*boast. For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life. (Ephesians 2:8-10)*

I have enjoyed and benefitted from going to the ecumenical Wednesday Lent Lunches and Worship hosted by five downtown congregations, and in which we were included this year. It's been great to see both new and familiar faces – this past Wednesday (3/20) I sat next to the wife of the pastor of First Pres from 1976 – 1993, and a brand new resident of Waynesboro who just moved into Summit Square a month

ago, a Roman Catholic.

Pastor Barrett Owen of First Baptist – who will be joining us in our Palm Sunday procession this year – preached, and he started with a statement about Lent, that it is no fun, because he said, one of Lent's messages is "you're going to die." *From dust you came and to dust you will return*, we start the Season with, and we conclude with Jesus' death, and his being put into the ground. And yet, Pr. Owen went on to say, between the dust we have been borne from, and the dust we will return to, there is life, and the promise that the dust we will return to is not the end of the story.

The Apostle Paul shared the words that are at the heart of our Lutheran faith – they are printed above, that it is what God has done that saves us, that gives us life. And we know that

God promises through the risen Christ that God will be with us until the close of the age, to lead us to God's very self, forever.

We will die, this is true, but in between the dust from which we were formed, and the dust to which we will return, is THE NEW LIFE WE LIVE. The life that God created for us in Christ Jesus "for good works" – for the good of this world and for ourselves! That's why we gather all through Holy Week, celebrate on Easter Sunday, and name ourselves Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church! By Grace we have been saved!!

Here's our Holy Week Schedule:

**Palm/Passion Sunday, 10 a.m.** – St. John Episcopal, St. John the Evangelist Roman Catholic, Main Street United Methodist, First Baptist, Christ Tabernacle Church of God in Christ, and maybe Waynesboro Seventh Day Adventist! – will join together on our front lawn to shout together "Blessed is the One who comes in the name of the Lord" – and process down Main Street to show our unity and hope in Christ, the Crucified One, who died and rose again for all of us!

**Maundy Thursday, 10 a.m. and 7 p.m.** – We'll share in Holy Communion, offer Footwashing (7 p.m.), and strip the Altar in preparation for Good Friday. Special Music during the stripping of the Altar will help to lead us into pondering in our hearts (like Mary, the mother of our Lord) the great love God has for the world in order to send his Son for the sake of our dying to sin and rising to new life with Christ.

**Good Friday, 3 p.m.** – We join with St. John the Evangelist for *The Way of the Cross*, walking in our neighborhood at the stations of the Cross. We meet at St. John, travel down 11<sup>th</sup> street to Wayne Avenue and the Library, then return to St. John.

**4:30 p.m.** – *The Gospel of John* – We will view the Gospel of John (the movie) from its start to the burial of Jesus. The movie uses no language other than the gospel itself. To "read" the gospel of John and follow the gospel until the crucifixion gives an opportunity to understand the Passion of Jesus and why Jesus died on the cross for our sake, and what our life as followers of Christ is all about. We'll watch the movie and have a light meal available while viewing up to the time of Jesus' arrest.

**7:00 p.m. - Good Friday worship**

at Grace – we'll "read" the Passion according to St. John using the film "The Gospel of John" and its account of Jesus' arrest, death, and resurrection. Grace choir will also present an anthem, and we'll behold the Life Giving Cross of Jesus.

**Easter Vigil, 7 p.m.** – We gather outside to process inside for this ancient liturgy that reminds us of the fullness of God's desire for our care and salvation, and we'll Affirm our Baptism and welcome *five new members* into the life of Grace!

**8:30 a.m. Easter Breakfast,**  
**10:00 a.m. Worship** - We rejoice that Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen Indeed! Death has lost its sting, We live a new life every day because of Christ's Resurrection from death to life!

The Season of Lent since the earliest years of the Church has been a time of preparation and discipline; a time of deepening one's faith in the One who lived, died and rose again, so that each of us, and the whole world (John 3:16-17) might truly live. There is a whole range of activities, from an exercise of Lenten discipline, to Worship, to Lunch or Supper Fellowship. Come and join in the Season of Lent at Grace!

**Wednesday Ecumenical Lunch and Worship - 12:00 Noon Lunch, 12:35 p.m. Worship** - A long standing tradition in Waynesboro has been for a number of downtown congregations to meet for lunch with a devotional worship service during the noon hour. Lunch begins at Noon and consists of soup, sandwiches, cookies and a beverage; the cost is \$3.00. It's requested that we have a count of people taking part in the lunch from our congregation, so please use the Wednesday Lunch Sign-Up to make a reservation for lunch each week. ## Odds and Ends Continued

**We Need Your Help at Grace!** One of the blessings that God's Spirit gives us as a congregation is that we ALL have gifts, talent and time TO SHARE, which allows the ministry of Grace, and God's Mission for us, to continue:

- **Altar Guild** - We need help with simple tasks - (a) *Filling the oil candles at Christmas and Easter* - and (b) we need *regular volunteers* for our Guild to continue strong, and not overburden current members. Can you volunteer even once per quarter? Contact Nancy at the Church Office, or Jean Morgan, chairperson of the Altar Guild.
- **The Nursery** - We need Nursery volunteers in order to have the required two persons to care for young children under five during the service. Contact Nancy at the Church Office if you can help, or sign up on the sheet in the Narthex.

**Prayers and Parking Lots**—Over the last several months, members of the church council, Pastor, and the Property Committee have been discussing the need to resurface, restripe, and increase the number of handicap parking needed for our members. Believe it or not, we do not think the parking lot has been resurfaced for 60+ years!!! How can that be? Mainly due to the hard work of our members, over the years, they have patched, tarred, prayed, and made some minor repairs. Their work has allowed us to make our parking lot serve this congregation for the life of our building. A typical parking lot is good for about 20 years and we have well exceeded that statistic.

Let's be honest – none of us really wants to spend money to repair the parking lot! It is not like an organ, or the chapel, or fellowship hall, something we see or enhances our worship experience. It is not the most glamorous of projects, kind of like replacing windows or HVAC systems – we don't necessarily think about them or focus on them, but we know when we do not have them or they break. Being good stewards of our building and property has been important to the life of this facility. The new parking lot will provide our members, visitors, and guests that use our building, a welcoming experience to Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church.

We anticipate the cost of this project to be approximately \$60,000+ dollars. Over the next several weeks, please take some time to look at our current parking lot and see for yourself the need we are facing. You will be hearing more about this project after the Easter season.

## Communication Subcommittee February 5, 2019

At the Church Council retreat last fall a subgroup of Gordon Putnam, Robin Crowder, Marlene Shaw, and Pete Giesen was formed to look at how we communicate with one another at Grace. Ron Almarode later joined the group. Traditionally we have communicated by talking to each other and sending things through the mail. These are still excellent ways that members of Grace communicate with each other. However there are limitations to that communication style.

Grace is moving into the 21<sup>st</sup> century of communication. Tyler Wertman in the last few years had developed our website, Facebook page (two in fact, more later), Instagram page, and other electronic communications. Gordon Putnam has taken over the web page and is working to keep it updated with the help of others. It goes without saying that not everyone is on-line or interested in our electronic communication, but it is a fast and sometimes easy way to inform the congregation of events and changes.

Email and One Call have been used to inform about 200 members of Grace concerning important events or changes that come suddenly; for example the death of a member and funeral arrangements, closing of the church, special events, etc. Email is also used to contact individuals with committee notes, or special information. We have not learned how to use texting to distribute information but that may be coming.

Facebook has been used to share our worship serve, photos from events, information that people want to give out to others. There are two Facebook pages, one is a general page that anyone has access too. The other is restricted to only those who ask for permission to be on it. This restricted page allows us to post information and pictures that are specific to Grace members.

The Web page has information about Grace for both members and non-members. The weekly Sunday bulletin is available and in the future members may choose to use their electronic tablet for the Sunday morning service. Grace Notes is published on the web page. The sermons and worship services can be accessed from the Web page.

There is information about our staff and who we are as a church. Our church calendar is updated in real time. The web page has information about our 125-year history and pictures from our past 125<sup>th</sup> celebration. The web page will continue to grow and be a tool for members and also for those wanting to know about Grace.

Moving into the 21<sup>st</sup> century of communication is not easy however the communication committee is attempting to use it as best as we can.
