Easter, the
Resurrection,
and You – If you read the stories of
Easter and what happens to the disciples, what it

really comes down to is that all that they had learned from Jesus collided with all that they experienced in their daily lives; and it began to result in "Resurrection life." In a very real way, everything they had to deal before Jesus' death continues after Jesus rose from the dead. But now, what Jesus taught them, and what they learned from the Word of God came into clear focus, and it made all the difference with each new day.

Luke's gospel especially makes the point that to prepare for faithful daily living, and to understand what Jesus' life, death and resurrection meant for their lives, followers of Jesus have had to be open to God's Word. This is, of course what was at the heart of the Protestant Reformation. Sola Scriptura! was one of the cries of the Reformation – Only Scripture! To point the way to Life that really is Life. I have a friend who says that when people talk to him about the world around them and see all that is wrong with it, and wonder what to do about it, he asks them, "when is the last time you've read God's Word?" And if the person says s/he hasn't entered into the Word lately, he gently asks what's behind that.

You may or may not know that the writer of Luke's gospel is the writer of Acts, that great book of the New Testament which gives us a snapshot of the early Church, and all that energized a group of fishermen, tax collectors, business people, women and men, Jews and Gentiles, rich and poor, from all over the known world to become a vibrant source of God's love and purpose for the world. What you'll find is the Word of God shared between the people, Prayer for God's Spirit to enter and blow a fresh wind into their lives together,

and being open to what God will do next in and through them.

Sounds like a plan! We'll be starting a new Bible study in April. Look for details in the next couple of weeks and come and be a part!

In-Person Worship – The months of April and May, we will continue to monitor four sources of information that will continue to guide how we are worshiping in person:

- The rate of positive cases in our area. As of the writing of this article, that number was 2.6% for all cases, well below the 5% number recommended for In-Person indoor activities.
- The rate of Covid infection per 100,000 cases. This rate varies according to locality, but currently in most of the localities where Grace members live, we are below the 10/100K rate recommended for a return to indoor In-Person activities.
- The percentage of Covid cases in the hospital ICU. The number of cases at Augusta Health is well below the recommended percentage of cases.
- The Georgia Tech Covid Event Risk Planning Tool that assesses the chance that a person in attendance at an

event like Grace worship would have Covid-19. Our risk level for 30 in worship is at or below 10%.

We will continue to monitor these sources of information, as well as the guidelines for public meetings published by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and the Virginia Department of Health (VDH). As of the writing of this article, the recommendations remain firmly in-place for masking and distancing, even if you have received a vaccine. When these statistics or guidelines change to allow for relaxed-but-still-safe changes, our Worship Resumption Sub-Committee will make new recommendations to Council.

In the meantime, we're in this together! Christ is alive and guiding us! Thanks for your care, patience, and most of all, openness to the ways God continues to guide Grace forward as A Community of Servants Sharing in the Word and Work of Jesus.

Highlights of Congregation Council Meetings March 16, 2021

The Church Council met on March 16, 2021. The primary topics of discussion involved racism; the continuation of live, in-person worship; the upcoming Holy Week Worship Schedule; and the nomination of new Church Council Members.

The ELCA Statement on Race, Ethnicity and Culture, a 28 year old document, was shared with Council, and discussion followed. Here are some of the highlights: While Christ is always tearing down walls of division, we keep rebuilding them with familiarity, fear, lack of empathy and understanding. We love our liturgy and our old familiar hymns and we want to keep them. There is fear of change and incorporation of other church's customs and wondering if change is a mutual goal or only a one-way street. We have our doubts about the nature of change: is it genuine Agape love or just a sense of social obligation? We seem to lack empathy, understanding of black history and how they live their daily lives. We pray for change, but what comes after that? While no specific date was established, this dialogue will most likely continue at a future date.

A lowering of the positive Covid rate in the SAW health district is allowing grace to resume in-person worship. Masking and social distancing will be of utmost importance. There will be music, but no singing. Ushering duties will consist of temperature reads upon arriving at the church door and ushering worshipers to their seats before the service and a controlled exiting from the pews after the service. Worshippers will pick-up their own bulletins and holy communion chalices, and place their offerings into the collection plate located in the Narthex.

The Holy Week schedule will be as follows:

- Palm Sunday, March 28, 10:00 a.m.—In-Person Worship
- Maundy Thursday, April 1, 7:00 p.m.—Virtual Only
- Good Friday, April 2, 7:00 p.m.. Virginia Synod Virtual
- Easter Vigil, April 3, 7:00 p.m.—Virtual Only
- Easter Sunday, 8:30 a.m. and 10:00 a.m.—In-Person Worship

In-person attendance will be limited to 30 people per service. Services will be added as needed. Worship will be limited to 45 minutes and we will continue to use individual holy communion chalices.

Fourteen church members have been nominated to replace the five (5) outgoing members and outgoing youth member. The Council is now awaiting for the nominees to accept their nomination to move forward. There will also be a need for a new Church Council Secretary effective June 1.
