Pastor's Page

There is a mystery about the Cross of Jesus that we encounter every year during Holy Week. Writer and theologian Dietrich

Bonhoeffer, in his well-known book *The Cost of Discipleship*, states it simply: "When Christ calls us, he bids us come and die." He goes on to add: "Thus it begins; the cross is not the terrible end to an otherwise god-fearing and happy life, but it meets us at the beginning of our communion with Christ."

The Easter dawning of the disciples, which continues to enlighten their lives through Pentecost and beyond, is a dawning that in the death and resurrection of Jesus, everything is made new! Everything in their lives was different. Fearful and running away and hiding behind closed doors, they became standing and free and bold out in their community. Old ways of seeing the world began to dissolve in seeing people and the world in new

ways. They came to see their lives "in communion with Christ," whether they saw Jesus and his hands, and feet and side, or whether they saw Jesus in the "the least of these" (Matthew 25:31-26) after his ascension into heaven.

I have mentioned throughout the Lenten Season that Lent has been a season of preparation for those who were to be baptized at the Easter Vigil, one of the primary festivals of baptism held during the year. Martin Luther, in his explanation of the baptismal life we all share, asks and answers a question which I believe beautifully encapsulates what happens to us when we "come and die:" ***What then is the significance of such a baptism with water?*** *It signifies that the old person in us with all sins and evil desires is to be drowned and die through daily sorrow for sin and through repentance, and on the other hand that daily a new person is to come forth and rise up to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.*

“The cross is not the terrible end to an otherwise god-fearing and happy life...” it is, “on the other hand that daily a new person is to come forth and rise up to live before God...” New life! A new way to live and act, and rejoice in the world!

I hope you will enter into the story on Palm Passion Sunday, and in the days of Holy Week that we observe: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, the Easter Vigil, *and* Easter – the Resurrection of our Lord. So we can enter into the joy of our Resurrection life in Christ!

Christian Education at Grace:

There are a lot of great opportunities for growing in faith and life at Grace right now!

- Eric Hilker is facilitating a discussion of the book *Making Room: Recovering Hospitality as a Christian Tradition* by Christine D. Pohl. Though the class has met twice, there is still time to jump into the his important biblically based discussion of what it means for us – as individuals, and as a congregation – to practice hospitality. Talk with Eric, myself, or Susan Myers to learn more, or check out the calendar for the next class.
- All God’s Children Discussion Group – a long standing book discussion group focusing on

racial equity and justice – is finishing their discussion of the book *How the Word is Passed* by Clint Smith. Soon to start is *Jesus and the Disinherited* by Howard Thurman. Rick Bump is facilitating the discussion; ask Rick, Linda Meyer, or Carolyn Barrette about the group and check out the announcement elsewhere in this newsletter for dates and times (as well as the Calendar). The discussion is rooted in our faith in Jesus, and our call to “all the world.” Come and be a part.

- UPCOMING – I will be planning a class on Planning for the End of Life. Many years ago, Grace had a class on such preparation and planning, and we will provide details in the upcoming weeks.





Highlights of Congregation Council January 17, 2023

- Pastor and five other members from Grace are going on a mission trip to a children's school and home February 11-18.
- We finished 2022 in terms of pledge giving with record income, \$14,000 above budget. Spending was \$3,600 above budget which ended in a surplus of \$9,788.
- Work is continuing on the Strategic Plan.
- The refugee family continues to thrive and accomplish amazing things.
- A new pictorial directory is in the works and pictures are being taken.
- There is an interest in Sunday School for fourth and fifth graders.
- An ecumenical youth event on January 8 raised \$770 for the Foster Ministry Organization.
- The Property Committee continues addressing the church roof replacement and resolving leaks.
- Annual Meeting will be held February 19.
- Grace will be sending delegates to the Virginia Synod Assembly in June.
- A prayer vigil is being held at the YMCA on January 21 as a result of the anti-Semitic drawings on the YMCA mural.

Highlights of Congregation Council February 21, 2023

- Coronavirus Committee recommends keeping everything status quo.
- Strategic Planning Committee is contacting the leaders of outreach and service ministries to get basic information about our ministries. This is to inform and engage current members as well as visitors in the word and work of Jesus.
- We are working with the refugee family to obtain their documentation. Things are going well.
- Outreach Mission remains very active in the church as well as the community.
- Interest has been expressed in Grace putting on a Christmas play this year.

Food Pantries - Thanks, and Continuing Need— Many thanks to those who have donated Peanut Butter, Mac 'n Cheese, Personal Hygiene items, and Dried Rice and Beans to our local food pantries. Covid Policy at Grace

- Masking is optional during worship.

Grace is working with other congregations in Waynesboro to determine whether we can work TOGETHER to help address the needs of our community. In their first game Chukizo scored the two goals for the Teal Team and Isaac shows some good defensive skills. Please pray that that boys will make new friends and enjoy this experience that enables them to use skills they learned in the camp in Africa.

Phiston is getting ready to enroll in an introductory college class at BRCC for the summer and is considering learning to drive, while Pastor Pingel continues to work with Jules on helping him find a class to lead to obtaining his learner's permit.

They just received word that Jules and Phiston will be moving to full-time employment status this month – hooray! Masoka continues to work on learning English through the Building Bridges women's zoom class. She hopes to be able to seek employment once Happy can be included in day care and the adults schedules can be adjusted to accommodate three of them working. Pastor April and Erin Spencer from Westminster continue to work with the family to understand and organize their finances and the details of their refugee status.

Please continue your prayers and support for this family as they are learning all the ins and outs of becoming independent in our American culture!

GRACE HIKER HOSTEL 2023

May 22 – June 17

Grace Hiker Hostel first opened in 2005 and has been sheltering Appalachian Trail hikers during the northbound heavy thru-hiker season ever since, excepting the two years we couldn't open our doors during the Covid pandemic. That's 16 years of welcoming hikers into our Fellowship Hall and Youth Room space!

With overwhelming support from then-Pastor Humphrey, the Church Council and a very generous congregation, we opened our space to hikers passing through Waynesboro and, over the years, our congregation, Church Council and Pastor Pingel have continued to support what we offer AT hikers: respite, food, fellowship and an opportunity to meet local community members. The response from hikers has been very positive – many remember Waynesboro as a trail town which became a highlight of their trek. How do we know this? They send us postcards from the trail and summit finishing photos! And our congregational volunteers are always excited to hear stories from trekkers from other parts of our country and even from all over the world.

We provide the following for hikers: showers, wifi, big-screen TV and computers/printer, snacks, breakfast foods, a meal on Thursdays and the opportunity for a Vesper service, and cots in our air-conditioned Fellowship Hall. Our capacity is limited to 20 individuals, but in recent years we average only about 10 hikers per night. As the years have passed, other venues have opened up for hikers (Stanimal's Hostel, improvements at the YMCA campground) but we still get a select group of individuals who prefer what we provide: safety and quiet – and, important for those on a 5 or 6 month long pilgrimage - a FREE stay!

We ask hikers to sign our register and we take a photo for our records. Hikers may stay over a second night but must fold up their cots and vacate the premises between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. We do offer to keep their large backpacks for them during the day.

To accomplish all of the above we rely on Grace liaison people (Linda Meyer and Jean Morgan) and weekly overseers (Jill Byrd, Irma and Woody Graf, Marit Anderson and Mark Pershal). Important are volunteers from the congregation who help at check-in time (5-8 pm nightly) and volunteers who are willing to bring a sleeping bag and spend a night at church. (We mostly use Valley Music Academy space for our volunteers to sleep over.) We need to have two volunteers at check-in time who welcome and help to orient the hikers coming in to our facilities and we like to have two volunteer overnights. One of those overnights needs to stay until 9 a.m. check-out or an early riser volunteer needs to come in from 7-9 a.m.

We usually put announcements in the May church bulletins asking for non-perishable donations (pbj, snacks, canned juices, some hygiene items) prior to the Hostel opening, and – once the Hostel is open – fruit, baked goods, etc. are always welcome. A sign-up sheet for volunteers will be at the back of the church on May Sundays after worship.

So, won't you join in on this unique hospitality mission outreach effort?
