Pastor's Page

My daughter Hannah was fortunate enough to be selected for Governor's School starting in just a short while. For

some of the classes she is taking this Fall, she has needed to read and study during the summer. She's read one of the classics of English literature; also, a History text; she has been doing some math problems in preparation for a math class she will be starting.

A Grace member was hospitalized recently, and is currently in a rehab facility. She was prescribed the rehab facility to build strength back up in her legs and arms. In order to return to independent

living she needs to walk on her own, show she has enough arm strength that she can get things out of the cupboard.

I have talked with a couple of our confirmands about some of the activities they are involved in: for example sports, martial arts. Not only are there games to attend, sometimes out of state even, but there are practices, and in some cases, some personal lessons so the confirmand can improve on his/her sport, or advance in proficiency in the martial arts.

Our Lutheran Christian confession is clear, as is God's Word: we are made right with God by God's action, God's grace, through Jesus Christ. We are forgiven. New life is ours each and

every day through our baptism into Jesus Christ and his death and resurrection. It is a free and amazing gift! What is also clear through our Lutheran heritage is that we *participate* in faith and life.

It is obvious to any of us: you can't really get ready for and English literature class without reading English literature; if someone is in physical rehabilitation, one can't expect to advance without attending the rehab classes, and then work on those exercises to build one's strength up. There's much less of a chance to start on the sports team, or gain the next level belt in martial arts without practice.

In the same way, the Church has talked for 2000 years about Scripture reading, Prayer, Studying together as God's people, and acts of service toward others. Jesus modeled and taught this to his disciples; it remains true 2000 years later.

August is a transitional month; before we know it school will have started. Grace activities resume: Sunday School, Christian Education during the week, Fall service activities like

Rise Against Hunger, the possibilities of continuing our relationship with Christ Tabernacle this Fall. Kick-off activities that allow us to enjoy fellowship together, like the Ice Cream social later this month. Come and Worship! Learn and discuss faith through Sunday School, Book Study or Bible Class. Take steps to be in the Word of God and prayer, daily – I told the story of a church member who said he had no time for reading the Bible, but the pastor said to put a Bible in the bathroom where he brushed his teeth and read for as long as you brush your teeth; and in 6 months, the church member had established a regular discipline of scripture reading. Start small! Pray the Lord's Prayer each morning and night, and add a prayer of gratitude for today's blessings, and a prayer that asks for the healing of the world that is so needed. Pray with your children. Sing Jesus Loves Me every day! Be a blessing to a neighbor. Take part in Rise Against Hunger in September.

All these things orient us in the right direction, to life that really is life!

Odds and Ends

We need school supplies! As a new school year approaches, families will begin stocking up on school supplies. However, in many families around the U.S. and the world, due to extreme poverty, new school supplies are not an option. In Honduras, for example, this means that children are unable to attend school because they do not have these necessary supplies. Lutheran World Relief has been partnering with Children's Gift Ministry to distribute school kits to 14,000 children annually since 2015. Go to lwr.org/getinvolved for information.

Grace Quilters have been working this summer sewing backpacks to hold these urgently needed school supplies; and we are asking YOU, the congregation to help us fill them! We will have a box at the rear of the Narthex to hold donations. Items needed are:

- Four (4) 70 sheet spiral notebooks of wide or college ruled paper, 8x10.5", no loose leaf paper
- One (1) 30 centimeter ruler or one with both centimeters and inches
- One (1) pencil sharpener
- One (1) pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Five (5) unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers, secured together with a rubber band
- Five (5) black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink) secured together with a rubber band
- One (1) box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One (1) 2 1/2" eraser

Thank you in advance for your assistance with this project. We will keep you updated on our progress.

Graces Fall Mission Outreach Programs

Summer is rapidly coming to a close with school starting early, Labor Day around the corner and many of our church activities such as Sunday School and weekly Bible Study resume. As we concentrate on our mission statement of "A Community of Servants Sharing in the Word and Work of Jesus", listed are some of the areas where you can become involved this fall:

Rise Against Hunger -- September 7 from 10 to 12 at Kate Collins Middle School and is a food packing event.

CROP Walk—Is on September 29 at Ridgeview Park in Waynesboro and is a walk to raise money for Blue Ridge Food Bank and World Hunger.

Backpack Program—Grace packs food for school children at William Perry. This takes approximately 30 minutes to pack. We need a coordinator for a team. If we have 2 teams, each team will pack approximately once a month during the school calendar.

Disciples Kitchen-- We serve lunch at Second Presbyterian Church about 6 times a year. Help is needed with food and serving. We serve breakfast at Basic Methodist Church every other month. A breakfast coordinator is needed. Both of these take only a couple hours to serve.

Quilting—The quilters meet regularly on Tuesdays starting in September and go thru May. The quilts are functional quilts. Sewing knowledge is not required. There are some in the group that enjoy sewing the tops and they are hand tied which is a very basic knot. There are other tasks that don't need any special skills. The quilts are delivered to Lutheran World Relief to be distributed across the world. Often there is lunch at a local restaurant where much fellowship occurs as well.

Grace Walkers—A small group has been walking the Greenway on Thursday mornings this summer. Meet at the church parking lot at 8:30 and head to the Greenway. It takes approximately an hour and there can be any pace that suits you. This is also a time of fellowship and a way to get to know our church family better. As the weather cools, we do hope that more with join.

Meals on Wheels---For many years Grace has delivered meals to the homebound thru the Waynesboro Senior Center. This requires many volunteers during the month. Watch for Grace Notes and for the sign-up sheet on the table in the Narthex this fall.

Cold Weather Shelter—Grace will host the WARM Cold Weather Shelter February 3 to 10. There will be many opportunities to help during that week including check in hosts, overnight hosts and providing and serving meals.

Our work has grown over the recent years and, thanks to supporters like you, we are continuing to impact the lives of many homeless and formerly homeless neighbors. Each donation is an investment into the future of our community and its most vulnerable members. Your gift has been invested into life changing programs such as our:

- WARM Cold Weather Shelter- emergency winter shelter focused on public health intervention/reduction of cold weather related health and harm occurrences, and resources/referrals for 125-135 homeless adults each year. 100% of our guests are offered the opportunity to work towards stability and the guests served include many homeless older adults and seniors on fixed incomes, veterans, and adults with disabilities.

Last year, 18 families with 31 children were given hope for the future through the program and most transitioned into stable housing. Each year, our staff are able to help over 75% of the families served move into more stable and self-reliant chapters of their lives.
 - o Aftercare & Outreach- Our intensive in-home case management and homeless prevention support services that are offered to all families transitioning from Ruth's WARM House. Former residents participate for up to one year with the goal of remaining stably housed long-term, increasing wages, reducing public assistance reliance and more. We also work with many nonresidential families and individuals to prevent homelessness and address additional risks.

Schools Buy House to Help Give Special Needs Adults Skills to Live Independently

A little blue house behind Waynesboro High School will now fulfill a big purpose for Waynesboro Public Schools' and Augusta County Public Schools' Post High Learning students.

The house, a collaboration between both school systems and the Shenandoah Valley Regional Program, will be the new site for the Post High Learning Lab. Waynesboro Schools' Director of Student Services said at Tuesday's meeting before the school board, "So this is real life. This is what kids are going to need to be doing after they leave the program "at age 22."

Students will have opportunities to learn "how to maintain a home environment," such as changing a light bulb or air filter, food safety, vacuuming, washing dishes and doing laundry.

Funding for the house does not come from the school system's budget, but through partnerships in the community and the Shenandoah Valley Regional Program.

Barber said in an email statement Wednesday that one of the pleasures of his job "is to see students with disabilities develop self-advocacy, independent living skills, and gain employment opportunities in jobs of their choosing."

In the coming weeks, an addition to the rear of the house is planned for kitchen space, and the current kitchen will be made into a wheelchair-accessible bathroom. Interior painting, electrical work and refinishing of the floors will be completed.

Waynesboro's Post High Learning Lab is made possible through partnerships with Nibco, United Way, Renewing Homes of Greater Augusta, the Woman's Club of Waynesboro/Augusta County, Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church, Brian Mininger from Bear Creek Construction, Nathan Trice who owns Pride Electric, LLC, Helmuth Builders, WHS Building Trades, City National Bank, Q & S Construction and Lowe's of Waynesboro.
