Pandemic Memorial Service



Dear Paul,

I want to thank you for your service to Summit Square as you provide leadership for our vesper's services each Sunday! Our vesper's services have been a huge success and the community finds them very meaningful. Our success has caught up with us and so we do not want to stifle the excitement of those attending. Residents are proud when their own pastor bringing the vesper's message and greatly enjoy sharing the service with other pastors whom they may well know.

This is where my second purpose for writing you comes in. We are finding we need additional help through volunteers to help supplement our pianist and help in getting residents in the units to the service. I am wondering if you have a pianist in your congregation that would like to substitute for Donna Pangburn, our pianist, on occasions when she is unable to do so? This would be only occasionally. In our service we use familiar music mostly coming from the hymn book. This would include accompanying our men's quartet. They too, sing familiar hymns so the task is not too difficult.

The core of our congregants for worship now come from independent living. Most attend their local congregation but a number of them are not able to make the trip each Sunday to their home church. Three units, Health Care, Assisted Living, and Memory Care are also a concern for they express interest in coming to worship but need assistance in making the trip up to the new chapel. We need help in bringing them to our service.

If you are comfortable in doing so, would you ask your congregation attenders if they would be interested in serving in either of these capacities?

Obviously, some churches have a number of piano players and others have few. Some churches have volunteers interested in this sort of thing especially if they have friends at Summit Square. Thank you for your consideration of this need.
