Pastor's Page

Once more Jesus spoke to them in parables, saying: 'The kingdom of heaven may be

compared to a king who gave a wedding banquet for his son. He sent his slaves to call those who had been invited to the wedding banquet, but they would not come. Again he sent other slaves, saying, "Tell those who have been invited: Look, I have prepared my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered, and everything is ready; come to the wedding banquet." But they made light of it and went away, one to his farm, another to his business, while the rest seized his slaves, maltreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged. He sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his slaves, "The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy. Go therefore into the main

streets, and invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet." Those slaves went out into the streets and gathered all whom they found, both good and bad; so the wedding hall was filled with guests.

'But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing a wedding robe, and he said to him, "Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding robe?" And he was speechless. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot, and throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth." For many are called, but few are chosen.'

Matthew 22:1-14

You know the old saying, "Clothes make the man, or the woman." You know how we judge others by their clothes, even though we try not to. You know how worried we can become if we are not sure what the appropriate dress is for an important event. And you know how

upsetting it is to arrive and find that you are seriously overdressed, or underdressed, for the occasion. It took me a year in this synod to figure out which meetings or events were casual, and which were "clerical collar recommended." And my first synod assembly back east in SC was serious culture shock. Suits and ties, dresses? The voting members in the eastern Washington Idaho synod dressed up with their best jeans and boots! Clothes may make the man or the woman, but actually, clothes make me anxious.

So I never liked this parable much. Luke's version is so much nicer. Poor and outcast invited in when the wealthy are too busy to come to banquet. But Matthew? Slaves murdered, an all-out war in the middle of a wedding feast, and a man tossed out by the bouncers because he did not come in "black tie" formal. What is Jesus saying about God? What is Matthew trying to get across to his congregation? The ushers will toss you out if you aren't wearing your Sunday Best? That refusing to come to church means we'll go out and hunt you down? That might improve attendance in our congregations. But Matthew, for all the instruction on obedience that his Gospel contains, has written an account full of the grace of God. Always in this Gospel, and in the other three as well, by the way, God's loving invitation comes first. All are invited. No test,

no pedigree, no dues. Matthew writes a gospel account to his congregation clearly stating that God's grace, God's embrace, is for all, freely given. Now, Matthew asks, how will you respond. How will you live out your life as part of the Christian community and as one of God's children? The wedding robe is not about what to wear to church, it represents what we bring to God's service. How we respond to what God has already done for us. How life in Christ is life transformed.

So often over the centuries we Christians have read Matthew and his warnings of judgment and told ourselves that these warnings are for the outsiders, the unbelievers, those who are not saved, destined to be cast into outer darkness. But that interpretation is not correct. Matthew portrays gentiles, foreigners, as some of the most righteous people in the gospel. The foreign women in the genealogy of Jesus, the Magi from the East, the Roman centurion at the cross. In contrast, those who are not practicing righteousness are often the most religious people, the teachers and leaders and elders; the people who know God and assume that what they want is therefore what God wants. People who are sure God is on their side without asking the much harder question, am I on God's side? According to Jesus, as told to

us by Matthew, we often are not on God's side, and must always ask ourselves that hard question. Am I living out my calling? Am I living out my baptism?

I am God's child, am I acting like it? Will others look at me, what I say and what I do, and will they see Christ through me?

You see, it really doesn't matter to God what we wear to church, because we each already wear the robe he has given us, the garment of baptism. We have been clothed with Christ and are now invited to come to his holy banquet. Matthew reminds his congregation, and us; wear your robe joyfully, cheerfully, eagerly, so that all can see it. Clothe yourselves with the righteousness of Christ, not with avoidance of his call or grudging and resentful obedience that does not come from the heart. You have your robe. All is prepared. Come to the banquet of our Lord. Black tie not required.

Update on the Mmeswa/Madawa family:

Our family and Welcome Team have continued to be incredibly busy. The oldest son and the baby have just had birthdays in the last few days. The mom has changed her English class to a computer-based class with several other women from a variety of countries. Health checkups and COVID vaccinations have been completed. We are working on obtaining DMV identification cards for the adults, and the men's work hours have been increased. They've done a "tour" on the Brite bus to learn a little more about how to get around town and the children continue learning to ride their bikes.

Financial education is also being provided and has included setting up bank accounts, learning how to use their accounts and debit cards, and budgeting and keeping track of their finances. The team is trying to figure out economical ways for them to purchase groceries and other needs, particularly for fish and goat meat. The children play and learn almost daily with our volunteers and their children, as we work to prepare them for starting school next month.

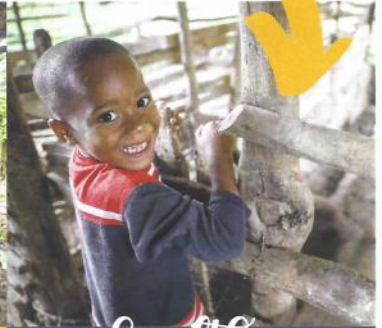

He was so impressed with the people he met and the kindness your church showed him, that we wanted to say "thank you" for being there for these hikers who need a place and a meal for the night.


