### Pastor's Page

We have a wonderful gift from the Holy Spirit as we will be having two baptisms in the span of a less than seven weeks: two baptisms!

Malachi Dolan was baptized on June 25<sup>th</sup>, the first baptism at Grace in about four years. And early in August, on Sunday the 6<sup>th</sup>, we will baptize Jackson Chaffin, who has been attending worship at Grace for a number of months now. He's been attending with his girlfriend Brooke Smith – whom I baptized about 20 years ago at my first call in Floyd County, VA!

Martin Luther tells us the Holy Spirit calls, gathers, enlightens and makes holy the Church, the Body of Christ. It is a source of joy that we also welcomed the Dolan family and the Wilson's by Affirmation of Baptism on the 25<sup>th</sup> of June; and will be welcoming Jackson into the family of faith here at Grace.

The wonder we have is the amazing claim of God's Word about what is going on here: the Spirit is gathering together the "parts of the Body" – which is what you and I are - in order to function as the Body of Christ in our community.

It's an amazing claim made by the apostle Paul in I Corinthians 12: We are the Body of Christ and individually members of it. Each of us has gifts of the Spirit that bear fruit in this world, so that the world – the community around us – may know the Good News of Jesus Christ. It's one very visible way God is at work in this world! One that *includes* and *involves* us!

August is often a time in the life of a congregation where we reflect the rhythms of the community around us. School starts once again. Many activities that had a break over the summer resume. Here at Grace we are gearing back up for Christian Education (adult, confirmation, children's classes) – stay tuned for

more information during August – and our Property Committee is completing summer projects to make sure we can continue the ministries that use our church building not only this Fall, but for years to come. Worship and Music, Fellowship, Finance, Stewardship, all are preparing for the coming months and New Year.

And yet, our Baptismal Life is what defines us. We “go in peace, [to] serve the Lord, thanks be to God!” Every day, whether we are here at Grace, or whether we are at school, at work, in the neighborhood, gathering with family; our Baptism into Christ’s death and resurrection make us who we are: the Body of Christ in this world. Holy Baptism is NOT a one day, one morning event: it transforms our lives, and it blesses the world, because God’s Spirit is working through you and me so that the world can recognize Jesus in and through us. In what we say and do. For each of us who welcome Jackson in August, who laughed and “awww’d” when Malachi squirmed and voiced his surprise at the water splashing on

his forehead, this is yet another time to “ponder anew, what the Almighty can [and does!] do” through you and me (from the Hymn Praise to the Lord, ELW 858), as the very Body of Christ in this world.

The Baptismal Font – The Worship and Music Committee this month will once again begin a conversation about our Baptismal Font, of which we will be having a study of Holy Baptism, and a history of the Baptismal Font and its design and use over the centuries. Look for opportunities to join in this study in the coming weeks.





**Rise Against Hunger Food Packing Event**—Grace is coordinating a **Rise Against Hunger** food packing event with some area churches. The event will be held on **Saturday, September 9**, at Kate Collins Middle School in Waynesboro. It will start at 10:00 am and be completed in about two hours. The last event Grace coordinated was pre-Covid and there were over 20,000 meals packed. The event is a fun morning with a variety of processing stations including mixing food, weighing food packages, sealing food packages, packing boxes of bagged food and runners who move items to each station. It is an event that everyone can help with. Grace Mission Outreach Team will be using a grant that we received from the Mission Endowment to help support this event. Our goal for the event is to pack 20,000 to 25,000 meals based on support from area churches. Remember to bring a hat or baseball cap because we are packing food. They do provide hairnets. **Bishop's Installation in October!** Bishop-Elect Phyllis Milton's Installation and Reception will be in Waynesboro, VA on Saturday, October 21st, at 1:00 pm; and Grace - as we did with Bishop Humphrey six years ago - will host the reception. We're just starting to plan and detail this out, but there may be an opportunity to help with the reception and transportation. Stay tuned in August and September for more detailed information!



**Christian Education at Grace:** Look for information over the next few Sundays in August about our Fall Christian Education! Adult Sunday School, Confirmation, Children's Classes, Holy Baptism and the Font weekday class...There is much to choose from to grow in Faith through Christian Education at Grace this Fall!



**Project Esperanza Fund Drive Update**—We have surpassed our \$6000 goal and have raised enough money to fully sponsor 12 children at \$600 per child, with donations and pledges totaling \$7225. **If you still plan to donate, please be sure all donations are in by August 3<sup>rd</sup>.** Grace members can contribute directly to the Church, noting the money is contributed to support Project Esperanza as a memo.

The mission of Project Esperanza is to form a global community focused on creating positive change and a sustainable future for Haitian refugee and immigrant youths in the Dominican Republic through education And empowerment. For the past 16 years, Project Esperanza has served the Haitian refugee and immigrant population of Puerto Plata, Dominican Republic in the areas of education, social aid, and community development. You and members of your church are invited to participate in a workshop on Saturday, August 19, to discuss what the Church's role and voice should be in speaking to the prevalence of gun violence in our nation. Churches in Augusta County and Staunton are all invited to send members.

*The purpose of this event is to encourage conversations about how Christ's Church can address the epidemic of gun violence that plagues our communities and our nation.*

**This is not intended to be a partisan or political event. We are not gathering to debate or take positions on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment, gun control, or gun ownership. This is not about blaming or pointing fingers.**

The Church is the body of Christ in the world. As Christ's hands, feet, and voice, we not only proclaim the good news of God's redemption, mercy, and love, but we are also called to speak Christ's peace to the world in the face of violence, fear, pain, and death.

This event is intended to encourage local churches to continue to hold conversations about and identify ways that they can be the voice and presence of Christ's peace in the world. What does it look like for God's people to address the epidemic of gun violence in our culture? How can we support law enforcement? What can we do to lessen the possibility of gun violence in our own community? How can we be faithful in ways that bring Christ's grace, healing, and peace in the event of gun violence?
