Advent and Christmas

– Look elsewhere in this issue for the schedule of events. Invite your

friends or neighbors to join with you! And most importantly, look for Jesus present now in these Seasons that are so important to our culture, and to you and me. As I noted last month, part of our task as faithful people is to be able to share with others why Jesus is so important: to you, to me, to this world. Part of my hope for Advent is that you'll be able to come to the Wednesday Vespers Worship services with their unique emphasis this year. But even if you cannot come, look at the themes of the services, and take time to think about *a change* to the way you live these next few weeks as December 25th and a New Year approaches:

Do Less – *What can you let go of or erase from your to-do list to be more present with Christ this Advent?*

Experience Wonder – *How can you and I experience wonder for God's works in this world and be fed by wonder [definition - a feeling of surprise mingled with admiration, caused by something beautiful, unexpected, unfamiliar, or inexplicable – God With Us!!] in the midst of this busy season?*

Hold On to Hope – *How can you and I hold on to hope in the midst of the world's troubles?*

Stop for FIVE MINUTES in your day, every day of Advent if possible – stop as an individual, as a couple, as a family – pray for God to be with you, ask these questions into your daily lives, and take the time to answer. *Look up the*

readings for the Sundays in Advent (they're in the bulletin every Sunday, and the newsletter): they'll clue you in to how faithful people over the centuries have experienced wonder, done less and held on to hope. You may be surprised at the difference in the way you see the world, and others around you. A blessed Advent and Christmas be yours!

Grace Receives \$15,000 Grant with three other Downtown

Congregations – The Harrisonburg, VA CPA firm of Young, Nicholas, Branner and Phillips, LLC recognized that in the Shenandoah Valley, there are an increasing amount of unchurched and skeptical teenagers about faith, and why Jesus is important in daily life. They offered \$15,000 to local churches to develop a new program to address these teens, and the Proposal by Grace, First Baptist, St. John Episcopal and Westminster Presbyterian was chosen! We'll be starting in the New Year to plan for activities to begin next summer. We'll identify interested persons in each congregation willing to serve on a steering committee, work with local organizations like YMCA and Boys and Girls Clubs, and identify school contacts in order to move forward with this important project and witness!

Emergency Preparedness at Grace

– It's not a subject we are enthusiastic about – the idea of preparing for danger while worshipping or attending another

function at Grace is not something we look forward to thinking about, let alone experience! Nonetheless, all good research into the topic says that a prepared congregation is much more likely to fare well if danger becomes a part of our life together – from shooter or other humanly threatening situation to natural disasters – storms, tornadoes, flooding, etc. Kathy Johnson heads up an Emergency Preparedness Committee that is “listening to the experts.” Kathy has been diligently gathering information by attendance in local church safety forums, and meeting with fellow congregation leaders as they talk about safety among the congregations. Just as we talk about Advent as a time for us to be “awake and alert,” we will soon be presenting to Grace some simple ways for us to be more prepared and alert in emergency situations, as well as other ways we can be more informed – and ready – just in case.

Highlights of Congregation Council Meeting

November 19, 2019

Pastor was thankful for time for continuing education, in particular, the ELCA Gathering of the Ministerium and the one-day retreat with local clergy. Both were formative and thought provoking in thinking about God's Mission for us at Grace. Grace, with First Baptist, Westminster Presbyterian, and St. John Episcopal were awarded a \$15,000 grant for new youth ministry in our community aimed at sharing the Gospel especially with unchurched or "uncertain" youth. Thanks to the Young, Nicholas, Branner and Phillips CPA firm in Harrisonburg for their vision!

Ron Almarode presented the proposed 2020 budget and after discussion, Council voted to approve the budget as presented. As 75% of the cost of the parking lot has been pledged, a contract has been signed with Josh's Paving. An updated agreement has been signed with Valley Music Academy.

Katheryn Johnson attended a meeting on Security given by the Central Shenandoah Planning Commission. This is similar to the Disaster Relief program we had last fall.

Dear Friends,

We are incredibly grateful for your recent gift of \$9,769.92 to Rise Against Hunger (a 501(c)(3) organization), formerly Stop Hunger Now, received 9/9/2019. Your gift gives us the ability to change lives, create sustainable communities and respond quickly in times of disaster.

There is a strong correlation between school attendance and food availability. If kids can get a warm meal at school, their parents are more likely to send them, recognizing the importance of that nutrition---sometimes their only meal of the day. There used to be major attendance issues at the Hilario Sanchez School in Nicaragua. Students weren't attending school to work in their families' businesses in order to eat. Rise Against Hunger partnered with the North Country Mission of Hope ensure our meals were administered at school to encourage attendance.

Things are changing for those kids in Nicaragua. Attendance rates are nearly 100% and academic performance has increased. These students are learning reading and writing, along with essential skills that will secure their place within society. From surviving to thriving, each student has a chance to be their best selves -- thanks to your support. *One warm meal a day is leading to literacy.*

And that's how we'll end hunger: one child, one day at a time, multiplied by dozens of corporate food donors, hundreds of partner agencies, thousands of communities, tens of thousands of meal packaging volunteers around the world and the generosity of supporters like you.
