From the Pastor

Pastor's Page -

Now you are the Body of Christ, and individually members of it is one of my very

favorite words from God's Word found in the Bible. It makes clear that Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church, and the Virginia Synod, and the ELCA, and the whole Church has a very powerful identity and purpose – we are the Body of Christ in this world. We are not perfect, we are saints and sinners at the same time, but through our Baptism into the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, God has made us to be the physical presence of Jesus Christ in the world!! This informs everything that we do because we

are *formed* together as the Church for a reason.

Baptismal Font – As you have observed for about a year now, the baptismal font has been at the entrance to the worship space, or nave. Since the earliest years of the Church (almost 200 years ago!) The Font has been located near the entrance of the Church building so when people come in to worship, or leave to "go in peace and serve the Lord" they remember who they are: baptized children of God [the body of Christ!] called to "go and make disciples" (Matthew 28:19). Last summer Grace had a special Sunday School class about Baptism, and this past Fall Grace Council studied Baptism and the location of a

baptismal font, and asked for design ideas to show the congregation for a font that allows for a more prominent use of water, while honoring the unique design of Grace's church building. Joan Ranzini, who has contributed her design and artistic talents to Grace's Mission 2000 plan, Grace's Chapel, and the Columbarium, has been asked once again to provide her expertise to the Font. Look for meetings to consider ideas in the first part of this year.

Grace's Wedding Guidelines -As with all documents that a congregation uses, it is important to update all documents that have policies and procedures attached to them, and documents that deal with change in the world around us. Because of two requests made recently requesting marriage between same-gender couples – one from the community, and one from a Grace family - Grace Council has begun looking at our Wedding Guidelines, and will be setting up forums in the next month or two concerning our

Guidelines and policy concerning same gender weddings.

Our guidelines already establish that except in special cases approved by Council, only Grace members, or immediate family members may be married at Grace. And many of us remember that the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America in 2009 in our Church-wide Assembly approved a resolution that congregations that chose to do so could, in our denomination, allow for same gender unions in a congregation. Because of the requests that have come Grace's way - from both our community, and our church family – it is time for us to gather as Christ's body to move forward concerning our wedding guidelines. A sub-committee of our Council will be meeting in February to set up forums for listening and conversation.

<u>Prayer</u> – In our bulletin, Grace has a Prayer List, where we pray for those in need: Grace members, those who are Grieving, those in long-term need of prayer, neighbors and friends, and a category that allows us to pray for every Grace member throughout the year, whether they are sick or not. We also have categories for our Nation and World, and for the Church. Prayer, put simply, is our communication with God; we pray to God in our needs and requests, as God asks us to in God's Word to us; but the other important part of prayer is to anticipate God's answer for what we pray for. Most of the times it is not easy, like asking Siri or Alexa, and getting an immediate reply. However we also know that the things we come to God for often do not have easy answers. Any relationship that remains strong depends on communication. I know there are times I have not communicated to Jill or to a friend or colleague about something I thought was "settled" or didn't need any additional comment, and found out quickly enough how important it was to continue to keep communication lines open. The same is true for us and God, especially when as the Church, we do not see things the same way

about what may be going on in the Church of today. So, because we are Christ's Body in the world, and Jesus himself did so regularly, <u>PRAY</u>. Whether for a friend or loved one, or neighbor or stranger in need, or when the answers are not clear at Grace, or when it is important to be thankful to God for all the ways God has blessed us. Prayer is not the last resort – "well I guess all there is left to do is pray..." – it is a "first thing" for all of our life, and all that's a part of it – PRAY.
