### **Pastor's Page**

On February 14<sup>th</sup>, three of our Confirmands will be Affirming their Baptism, and making promises

before God about their lives. These were promises that are similar to those made by parents when their child was baptized. Now, in using their own voice, speaking their own words, Kaitlyn Hull, Quinn Franklin and Zachary Rankin are making these promises.

When you last Affirmed Your Baptism, *you*, who are reading this also made these promises. We Affirm our Baptism during the Easter Vigil. At times in our past, the Affirmation was done during Easter services.

Here are the promises that are made, both in Holy Baptism by parents, and by all of us, whenever we Affirm our Baptism: Do you intend to continue in the covenant (promise) God made with you in Holy Baptism:

- To live among God's faithful people
- To hear the word of God and share in the Lord's Supper
- To proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed
- To serve all people, following the example of Jesus
- And to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

Please re-read these five promises that our confirmands will make on Transfiguration Sunday, February 14<sup>th</sup>. And then think of your intentions that you promised before God.

This time of Covid actually allows us to hear these intentions differently. I say this because the temptation is to hear the answers to these questions as "get your butt in church." And obviously we can't do that at this time, yet these baptismal promises hold true regardless. So what are these promises about?

The Season of Lent is upon us, Ash Wednesday is February 17<sup>th</sup>. A part of our liturgy changes: rather than shouting Alleluia's to God before hearing the Gospel, we sing a different tune: "Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love." Return is a word of repentance, and repentance is a change in direction.

The promises you and I - anKaitlyn and Quinn and Zach – make to Affirm our Baptism into Christ's death and resurrection is a promise – and intention - to follow a different path. It's the way we live in the world, and yet as we live in this world we seek to live as God intends us to. In our Baptisms, we recognize that we need each other – the Body of Christ – to support each other. In our Body of Christ/I Corinthians class the other night someone made the incredible observation that we give away some of our autonomy for the sake of gaining something far more important – to be a part of a Body that is joyful in our joys, hurts in our hurts, and flourishes together to be something much more than we can be

independently. We become a part of God's work here on earth that continues through the Body of Christ.

We gather in worship, not to have our butt in the pews, but to receive a word of good news that informs what we do in daily life. A word so much more life giving than what we hear on the news or from all the other voices that suggest we are the center of life. We are washed and fed to receive forgiveness and new life every Sunday, as well as every day. Every day is a new start in our life together!

We serve, we give, and are given opportunities again and again to see how much great blessing there is in serving others beyond ourselves (and the small circle of people we call our own) rather than in holding back, or keeping things for ourselves.

And we realize that standing up for what is right, to stand with those for whom there is no justice, to risk following where Jesus goes may mean the cross, but always something new and life-giving that follows, where we are a blessing, and richly blessed ourselves by following Jesus.

#### Two other observations:

- During the Affirmation of Baptism this coming February 14th, you will also be asked to make an additional promise: People of God, do you promise to support Kaitlyn, Quinn and Zachary and pray for them in their life in Christ? The world's commentary on this might be "Don't get involved, I don't really know them, I don't want to get in their family business, they've already got Confirmation mentors..." And yet if we truly are the Body of Christ, we share in joys, share in pains and flourish together as we support one another. How can we support Kaitlyn, Quinn and Zachary as they enter that stage in life when they are growing to adulthood and the choices of what they will do in life? And pray for them. Keep them in your prayers. We say rather blithely that we don't know what kind of world our kids will inherit, with a headshake of uncertainty. Does this not need our regular and fervent prayer for them?! As well as our own seeking of justice and peace where you and I live! This is living our Baptism!
- 2. For Kaitlyn, for Quinn, for Zachary, remember that at the very beginning *before* we state our own intentions we are reminded: **GOD made a covenant,**

a promise with us! A promise that is not dependent on how well we keep our promises. To say this is not to give us a pass in our own daily walk of faith, but it is a word of GRACE. The covenant God has made with us cannot be broken by us. Because God says so, in the way God describes himself (ask our current Confirmands Karley, Kiera, and Thea, they will tell you!): God is gracious, merciful, slow to anger and abounding in Steadfast Love. The Hebrew word we translate as steadfast love actually means a loyal love that will never be broken.

For our Confirmands, for you and me, this God so loyally and completely desires our relationship with him and with one another, that he sent his Son to reconcile the world to him, while showing us *life that really is life*.

That's the journey we are on with Kaitlyn, Quinn, Zachary, all of us at Grace, and the whole Church of Jesus Christ. Let's live it, together.



### **Highlights of Congregation Council Meetings January 19, 2021**

The Grace ELC Council met on January 19, 2021. The minutes of the December 8<sup>th</sup> Congregational meeting and the minutes of the December 15<sup>th</sup> monthly meeting were accepted.

Ron Almarode attended the meeting as a special guest of the Church Council to give an overall 2020 fiscal year-ending budget presentation.

The Grace Race and Reconciliation Study Group presented a viewing of a video titled Race in America, produced by the creator of Veggie Tails, a Christian animated show for children, Paul Vischer. He is an evangelical. Following the video presentation, the Study Group proposed that our congregation's attitude towards race relations be surveyed in the same manner as the survey conducted on LGBTQiA by Reconciled in Christ, a Lutheran Group whose resources the Council used early last year. The Study Group also proposed a special meeting of the Church Council to discuss their study of race relations and initiatives moving forward.

Pastor Pingel commented on the success of the special Ecumenical Worship Service of Prayer, Repentance and Christian Unity that was Held virtually on January 18<sup>th</sup>.

Due to increases in coronavirus cases and deaths in the SAW district, live, in-person services at Grace ELC will not be held at any time in the near future. Lent, Holy Week and Easter services at Grace ELC will be held, but whether live or virtually, will depend on the state of coronavirus at those times.

Confirmation classes are continuing at this time. Three confirmands from last year's class, Kimberly Hull, Quinn Franklin and Zachary Rankin will be confirmed on Transfiguration Sunday, February 14<sup>th</sup>. The Confirmands and their families will be recorded separately, and integrated into the Live service broadcast on the 14th.

All three elevators in our church passed their annual and their five year inspections by Shenandoah Elevator Company.


