Pastor's Page

This time of year many at Grace are visited – so that our homebound, and other members of Grace have a contact from the

Body of Christ during the Holidays. We are also re-invigorating our Eucharistic Minister guild so that our seniors and homebound have more of an opportunity to receive the Eucharist each month.

These past few weeks also remind us of the importance of our life together. Almost all of Grace's ministry is dependent on a LOT of people. On Sunday, December 18th, a group of people from 5 years old into their 80's remained to decorate the worship space for Christmas Eve. Another small group places the Poinsettias the day before Christmas Eve. Quietly a group of three people helped a Grace member with some home needs. Another group helped a family in need in Staunton. Still another group continued their

work relationship with a Congolese family being sponsored by Grace and Westminster Presbyterian with tutoring, teaching, helping to negotiate a new and very different world. Another group met in a Constitution Parking lot for prayer with friends from Christ Tabernacle. Two choirs prepare for Christmas Eve. A group of six continue to sort through information to determine some Strategic plans for Grace as we look at 2023. Various groups work to be good stewards of our finances. In the midst of health issues, and space issues at Grace (during a week in which a homeless shelter, a music academy and a yoga class met here), a group of women arranged a most appreciated and bountiful funeral reception for the Myers family.

God-With-Us, Immanuel is central to understanding who we are. We need something beyond us to help us be who are meant to be. An amazing God decided to become incarnate in the most vulnerable of

ways – a baby born into a feeding trough! – and witnessed by the farm laborers in the countryside tending sheep, so that they would share the good news that all would wonder at, even Jesus' (Immanuel's mother). They did this as the magi – astrologers as foreign as one can imagine – made their way to trouble all of Jerusalem, most of all King Herod, with their desire to behold a child, a king.

At the same time, we are called INTO something. To be a part of a Body, to be the hands and feet of Christ, to see Jesus in others. Jesus, whose kingship did not result in glory as WE understand it, but glory that comes through death on a cross and resurrection. Dying to self in order to live a new life.

It is a great mystery we are called into once again this Christmas and Epiphany. God bless you this Christmas Season and in the New Year.

Congregational Meeting 2023 Proposed Budget Vote: Meeting Minutes December 11, 2022

11:05 a.m.: President Robin Crowder called the meeting to order to vote on the proposed 2023 budget. His opening statement included thanks to Pastor Paul, and

the Stewardship Committee, especially Mike Trauscht and Fred Biggers, on the success of the Stewardship Campaign.

Ushers distributed paper copies of the budget and voting ballots to those interested.

Treasurer Ron Almarode spoke about the Stewardship Campaign and Grace's mission. He stated that pledges increased by approximately \$32,000 from last year and the spending plan increased by approximately \$29,000. There was no decrease in benevolence or ministry programs. Church staff compensation will be increased by 8.7%. He then asked if anyone in the Congregation had any questions, there were none.

President Crowder asked for a motion to approve the budget. The motion was so moved by multiple members and seconded by multiple members of the congregation. Members were then allowed to vote. President Crowder informed those watching via YouTube that votes could be cast via email by emailing grace.lc@comcast.net.

Meeting adjourned at 11:11 a.m.

Shortly after the meeting was adjourned, President Crowder received the inperson vote tally and announced the results: 59 approved, o disapproved. The 2023 budget proposal was approved by the Congregation.




Donations

- **Check-In teams**: 3-4 volunteers/night; assist Staff Host and welcome guests make them feel welcome, let them know we care, participate in time of fellowship let them know that God's love is present in their lives! Make coffee!
- **Shower Host**: 1 volunteer/night; ensure guests have needed toiletries, towel; monitor shower schedule and collect towels
- **Meal Teams**: Join a team to provide dinner for about 50 people; volunteer to prepare food, serve and/or clean-up. Assist preparing sack lunches, if time/able. January 23 29 we have 7 Teams scheduled; more volunteers are welcome to fill out teams. Welcoming individual volunteers as well as whole teams! If you're interested in leading a team, let me know!
- **Overnight Hosts**: 2 volunteers/night; assist the Staff Host overnight (in-person OR by telephone); in morning, make coffee and put out breakfast items and sack lunches, Clean up after.
- **Clean-up Team**: light cleaning duties. WARM will have guests complete basic chores (sweeping, mopping if needed, removing garbage). We will come in during the day (after the guests are gone,) to check the area, follow-up as needed Lysol bathrooms, showers; wash/dry/fold towels.

Refugee Family Update

The Madawa/Mmeswa family continues to be busy learning to create a home and a life in America. The children are thriving in school, Jules and Phiston are working steadily at Virginia Panel, Jules is working to pass the test for obtaining a learner's permit to drive, Masoka (and Happy) attend English classes at home online and are making good progress. Learning about bill paying and comparison shopping and American traditions and practices keep them (and the Welcome Team) on their toes!

They learned about Thanksgiving and are now deep into learning about our various Christmas traditions. While they come from a Christian background they have not had the experiences of Christmas trees and lots of lights and all that goes with our particular ways to celebrate the birth of Jesus – as well as all the secular ways that Christmas is celebrated in America. The Welcome Team decided to introduce some of these traditions carefully so that we don't overwhelm the family, so we did not ask the congregations to provide Christmas gifts. We did make sure that they have a Christmas tree that fits into their small living room; and the children learned to decorate ornaments for the tree. The Team members also provided some additional ornaments for the tree as well as a child-friendly wooden nativity scene. The children have participated in the children's Christmas pageant at our partner church, Westminster Presbyterian. See some pictures of the angels and a shepherd and Caesar at the end of this message.

The main gift we are providing them is to take some of the funds you all have generously donated and pay one month's rent for them – giving them a little flexibility for this time when bills can be higher and perhaps enabling them to find some gifts for each other.

Many, many thanks to each of you who have kept the family and the Welcome Team in prayer, as well as your generous donations of gift cards, school snacks, clothing, and your time and welcome with this wonderful family as they attend our worship services and negotiate life in Waynesboro. We are blessed to be a blessing – and blessed by their presence among us!
