### **Pastor's Page**

What will the Church look like in 2024? We could answer with some fear and trepidation based on what we have

heard *about* the Church around us. I can tell you as the new Dean of the Southern Valley Conference, that we begin the year with two vacancies in congregations around us; Christ, Staunton, and Bethlehem, Waynesboro. There is talk of a shortage of pastors. There are numerous articles about the future of the church, what it will look like.

I believe that you and I should begin with ourselves, because, *we* are the Church! In a very true way, you and I are what the Church looks like in 2024. Jay Beech's "The Church Song" is a great way for us to start the new year: We are the Church, the body of our Lord; We are all God's children, we have been restored.

**CCE&J**—We had 12 people attend the prayer vigil (Donna Yobs is behind the camera) and four more members joined us for lunch and fellowship afterwards on Saturday, December 16. It was a wonderful way to start the holiday season.









**All God's Children** meets on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Monday of each month at 7:00 pm in the Grace conference room. Our January agenda includes the following:

- January 8<sup>th</sup> We will conclude our discussion of *US: The Resurrection of American Terror* by Kenneth W Wheeler, covering Chapters 9-10 and the Afterword . The author is a Black ELCA pastor who takes us through his seven-decadelong journey that lays bare the terror of being Black in America. The book offers a deeply vulnerable and piercing portrait of the human toll of white supremacy and points to the Cross as a place of hope and reconciliation.
- January 22<sup>nd</sup> Start discussion of A Fever in the Heartland The Ku Klux Klan's Plot to Take Over America, and the Woman Who Stopped Them by Timothy Egan. The next book is a historical thriller by a Pulitzer and National Book Award-winning author that tells the riveting story of the Ku Klux Klan's rise to power in the 1920s, the cunning con-man who drove that rise, and the woman who stopped them. A Fever in the Heartland is compelling, powerful, and profoundly resonant today. The book marries a propulsive drama to a powerful reckoning with one of the darkest threads in American history.

**Words You Don't Want to Say, but We Must!** Those words are *COVID*, *flu, RSV and Winter Viruses*. We've had a number of members who have been sick in recent days and weeks. We are coming into a time when Health experts tell us to expect more cases. With this in mind please note the following:
