#### **Pastor's Page**

Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to

provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the day approaching. Hebrews 10:23-25

It is a mark of the church that we gather together for mutual conversation, help, prayers for one another, and encouragement. That's how we continue what begins when we gather at the Lord's table, how we carry this community with us, and live as the body of Christ, individuals, yes, but part of one body, responsible to each other, committed to each other, sacrificing for each other. Encouraging each other in faith and in life.

It is especially important for us to encourage one another because we bring for the faith and life of the community. I have had the following

experience in small groups and on retreats: the leader asks you to go around the room and each say what you have a special talent for, what you are especially gifted by the Holy Spirit to do. There is always an uncomfortable silence, some nervous shuffling, and looking at one another, but no one wants to speak, until finally one person says, "Oh, I really don't have anything I'm good at." And no one else says anything. So, now try it a different way. The group is gathered and the leader says to the first person, "look at the person to your right, and tell us what she/he is gifted by God for, what is a special talent in her/his life of faith." What happens? The flood gates open.

"She always knows the right thing to say." "He is such a good listener." "She never forgets to send cards to the folks who are ill." "He is a prayer warrior; praying for all of us and all who are in need." "She's an assisting minister with a wonderful presence." "He is a gifted teacher, and talented musician." "She always makes time to help out, no matter what the job is."

We who can be tongue-tied trying to come up with something that might be our gift, can talk on and on about how our sisters and brothers in Christ are gifted and living out their faith.

This is encouragement. This is giving the other person the courage to trust God, to answer the call to vocation, to step out in mission, when we are too inclined to belittle the gifts God has given us in the mistaken belief that to acknowledge our giftedness is bragging. Jesus teaches us to pray and practice our faith and give to those in need, in secret where only our heavenly Father will see, rather than looking for the applause of others for what we do. Very true. But then Jesus also teaches us that we must not hide our light under a bushel either! We can be so shy about admitting that we have talents and gifts, even to ourselves, that we end up not using them in service to God or to one another. It is especially important to remember this as we at Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church move forward in our process of discerning who we are as a congregation, and what our mission to this community, and the world, will be. This is a time for us to encourage one another so that we all can be listening for the guidance of the Holy Spirit together. And that means we must listen to others, even when they are talking about our own gifts for ministry.

A very wise women I knew years ago, one of my encouragers, told me this: If someone compliments you on something you have made or done, and you respond, "Oh, this old thing, it's nothing special," you have just rejected not only the kind words spoken, but the person speaking them as well. It is like taking a gift and tossing it in the trash. I had never looked at it that way before. When someone tells you, "You do that so well" or "you have the gifts for this ministry, could you consider taking this on?" don't dismiss it. Think about it, prav about it, talk to others about it. Others often can see in us what we have not been able to see for ourselves. And you never know when it might be that this encouragement itself is a word from the Lord, a call from God to make use of the gifts of the Spirit that we didn't know we had.

As disciples of Christ we are encouragers, called to lift up those who are low, affirm those who are unsure, give strength to those who are tired, comfort to those who are sad, and to accept the lift when we are low, the affirmation when we are unsure, the strength when we are tired, the comfort when we are sad. Either way, encouragement is the gift of God. So, instead of saying, "Oh, this old thing?" let us receive this gift and pass along this gift in thanksgiving and joy!

Ouilting News-The Grace Quilting group has been on hold since the beginning of COVID. Our time came to an abrupt halt 2 years ago when things shut down. We recently delivered 8 quilts to Westminster Presbyterian and Grace's Congolese refugee family. Bethlehem Lutheran has had several Saturdays making quilts to send to Ukraine and we have donated 10 quilts to go with their shipment. Grace's quilting group hopes to begin our "quilting season" on Saturday, September 10 in conjunction with the ELCA God's Work/Our Hands day. We will then be quilting on Tuesdays throughout the fall, winter and spring seasons. Please consider helping with this outreach. We do very basic hand tied quilts so there is a "job" for all levels—no quilting experience required. We can always use donations of cotton fabrics.
