Wedding Guidelines and Marriage at Grace: If you were not able to

attend the Congregation meeting scheduled for May

19th, perhaps you have heard by now that the resolution put forward by Grace Council for a vote by the congregation regarding same-gender weddings passed with a "yes" vote. The first reading for the May 19th Worship service prior to the Congregation meeting was from the book of Acts, the story of Peter baptizing Cornelius, a Roman Centurion, and his entire household. As with the whole book of Acts, the consistent conclusion of all the stories, and indeed the whole book, is that God is doing a new thing through the Holy Spirit; crossing boundaries and leading the Church where it had not gone before for the

sake of sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ.

This is our reason for being at Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church. We may name many other reasons why we're here, but the reason - from God's Living Word - that we are here is to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ with everyone God's Spirit either sends us to witness to, or sends TO us, for the sake of making disciples. The whole book of Acts, and indeed the New Testament provide example after example of the width and breadth of surprising people God's Spirit led the Church to share the gospel with! Dear Friends at Grace Lutheran,

Your community investment, through Waynesboro Area Refuge Ministry (WARM), has made a difference and is sincerely appreciated! Our work has grown over the recent years and, thanks to supporters like you, we are continuing to impact the lives of many homeless and formerly homeless neighbors. *Each donation is an investment into the future of our community and its most vulnerable members.* Your gift has been invested into life changing programs such as our:

- WARM Cold Weather Shelter- emergency winter shelter focused on public health intervention/reduction of cold weather related health and harm occurrences, and resources/referrals for 125-135 homeless adults each year. 100% of our guests are offered the opportunity to work towards stability and the guests served include many homeless older adults and seniors on fixed incomes, veterans, and adults with disabilities.
 - Outreach- partnerships with other service agencies that link homeless veterans and older adults to housing and/or support through our direct services and intakes. This year alone we've helped move 11 homeless veterans and family members off the streets and out of homelessness!
- Ruth's WARM House- 3-6 months transitional housing, case management, onsite groups/trainings, mentorship, mandatory employment and savings, and professional support for up to 7 homeless moms with children at one time. Last year, 18 families with 31 children were given hope for the future through the program and most transitioned into stable housing. Each year, our staff are able to help over 75% of the families served move into more stable and self-reliant chapters of their lives.
 - Aftercare & Outreach- Our intensive in-home case management and homeless prevention support services that are offered to all families transitioning from Ruth's WARM House. Former residents participate for up to one year with the goal of remaining stably housed long-term, increasing wages, reducing public assistance reliance and more. We also work with many nonresidential families and individuals to prevent homelessness and address additional risks.

On behalf of the homeless children and adults we serve, thank you for your gift of \$230.55. You are a hero to the most vulnerable members of our community! Mission Outreach Endowment Grants

At Grace's Church Council May meeting, Council reviewed and approved six grant requests from Grace's Mission Outreach Endowment totaling \$19,974.

Grants are being issued as follows:

Daily Living Center grant was for \$2,000 to help support day care health center for the disabled and elderly who are unable to be left at home alone due to health or cognitive issues.

Valley Program for Aging Services (VPAS) grant was for \$952 to help support for their Dementia Education Programs.

Raising Resources for Reader (3R's) grant was for \$2,458 to help support purchase of books for students at William Perry and Wenonah Elementary Schools summer reading and mitigating "the summer slide". The program is being expanded to Kate Collins Middle School next school year.

Basic Methodist United Methodist Church Community Outreach Programs grant was for \$1,564 to help support Basic with their Wednesday supper, Saturday breakfast and after school programs.

Shenandoah Valley Regional Program (SVRP) grant was for \$3,000 to support program for students with exceptional needs, ages 18 to 22 which is referred to as Post-High Program.

Habitat for Humanity grant was for \$10,000 to support Habitat "Starter Homes for the Poor" program in our area. This is a three year grant with \$10,000 issued each year during the next three years.
