What's going on at Grace?

Strategic Planning

– We are a Community Sharing in the Word and

Work of Jesus. This Summer, our Council and Round Tables will be looking at

- our relationship with the Community around us;
- our relationship with one another here at Grace;
- and how we support our Sharing in the Word and Work of Jesus, in order to discern:

What does God have in mind for us in the next five years? We have a Mission – to "go to Galilee" where Jesus is leading us to be his hands, his feet, his Body. After a pandemic, what does this look like? In the world we live in today, where is the Spirit guiding us? That same Spirit has gathered us together, just as we have been gathered for coming up on 128 years! I hope you will pray for God's guidance, and for your participation in God's Mission for us.

<u>A New Council, President and</u> <u>Vice President –</u> We installed new Council members and officers who will begin their terms starting now! Bob Barrette (second term), Fred Biggers, Jean Morgan, Nancy Schwiesow, and Andrew Sell are our new Council members. Robin Crowder was elected Council President, and Jerry Kite Council Vice-President. We are thankful for their leadership, gifts and talents.

<u>New Members</u> – We have begun a New Member Class that continues through June, and we anticipate five new members to become a part of Grace in July: first, Rew and Karen Walck, and Ron and Roxane Myers. Rew and Karen are son and daughter-in-law of Bob and Flo Walck, having moved a few months ago from Indiana; and Ron and Roxane have lived in Waynesboro a number of years, and are transferring from Bethany Lutheran. In addition, we anticipate that Ellen Moyer, a homebound member, sister to Joe, Minnie, Bobby, and Frannie Knicely, will also be joining with Grace at the same time.

"Fresh" Air-Conditioning This

Summer – Thanks to work by Brad Keefer, who worked with Ronnie Ritchie to look at replacement units for those that were probably 20 years old and not functioning. As a result, a large part of our HVAC system was replaced with new units that allow for more fresh air to enter into our education building and office area. In addition, thanks to assistance from Mike Trauscht and Jerry Kite, an HVAC engineering firm, Colonial Webb, was engaged to renovate our Nave air-conditioning system to open the system up so that fresh air will also freely flow in our worship space, greatly reducing the re-circulation of air – and improving the air quality as we worship. The work should be complete late June.

Planning for Fall - Post

<u>Pandemic?</u> We hope and pray so! We anticipate a lot of great activities: Fellowship, Christian Education, Sunday School, Children and Youth Activities, Service, Learning, Worship and Fellowship Activities with Christ Tabernacle, and with Downtown Congregations. Look for more news in July and August.

Pastor's Sabbatical – I will be applying for a sabbatical grant in September, and if necessary, in the beginning of 2022 in order to have a time away for study, rest and refreshment. You may remember that during Pastor (now Bishop) Humphrey's tenure at Grace, he took two sabbaticals during his 20 years. Now nearing completion of eight years of my call here at Grace, it is my hope to have some time as well. I hope to focus my study in one of three areas: our racial reconciliation work with Christ Tabernacle: Life in the Church Post-Pandemic (with a focus on technology and our growth in reliance on it); or the place of the traditional Disciplines of Faith in the modern Church. I will keep you posted as I prepare my proposal this summer.

Highlights of Congregation Council



Meetings May 25, 2021

The focus of the May meeting was on:

- 1. The formal approval of the nominees for the council and the election of council officers for the term June 1, 2021 May 31, 2023.
- 2. Changes to in-person worship
- 3. Approval of the Mission Endowment Fund distribution
- 4. Assignment of new council members as liaisons to the Round Table groups
- 5. Discussing the funding, application process and purpose of Pastor Pingel's requested sabbatical beginning either at the end of 2021 or sometime in 2022

The newly elected members to the council are Fred Biggers, Jean Morgan, Nancy Schwiesow and Andrew Sell, with Bob Barrette agreeing to remain for one more year. Robin Crowder was elected president and Jerry Kite vice-president. Ron Almarode was re-appointed treasurer and Kara Beth Glover was re-appointed auditor. The secretary position will be vacant as of June 1, 2021.

As we continue to monitor the Governor's and Synod's Covid guidelines, the following changes for in-person worship will be effective June 1:

- 1. Advance reservations will no longer be required.
- 2. Maximum capacity will be 85.
- 3. Temperatures will no longer be taken upon arrival.
- 4. Attendance lists will be taken for contact tracing purposes.
- 5. Social distancing will continue.
- 6. Masks will be required.
- 7. Individual chalices will be used.
- 8. Bulletins will be available for pick-up.
- 9. The collection plate will remain stationary for offerings.

We are again looking for Communion Assistants, Offering Stewards and Ushers.

The second study group of racial reconciliation will be begin June 14 with the book: "The Sum of Us: What Racism Costs Everyone and How We can Prosper Together" by Heather McGhee.

Donna Gum and Ron Almarode have volunteered to be representatives of Grace at the Virtual Synod Assembly on June 12.

Contemporary worship services will begin in June.
