We have a lot to celebrate this June!

Malachi Dolan, son of Jake and Rebecca Dolan, will be baptized on Sunday,

June 25th at Grace! We rejoice that Malachi will become a part of the Body of Christ that is the Church, And specifically Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church, and that God will claim Malachi and bestow the Holy Spirit upon him.

In addition, five other new members will Affirm their Baptism, and join with us at Grace on the 25th: Jake and Rebecca Dolan and their daughter Virginia, as well as Charles and Betty Karol Wilson. Jake and Rebecca are son-in-law and daughter to Tom and Holly Carper, with Tom and Holly the proud grandparents of Virginia and Malachi. Pray for these six sisters and brothers in Christ.

June also connects us with the larger

Church through the Virginia Synod Assembly, being held June 8-11 at Roanoke College in Salem, Virginia.

We will be electing a new Bishop, given the announcement by Bishop Bob Humphrey that he will not be seeking another term. Please pray for our delegates - Peggy Caister, Donna Gum, and Lily Pingel – as they not only take part in the election of a new Bishop, but many others as well (VP of Synod, Synod Secretary, Synod Council, Consultation Committee and Committee on Discipline); as well as bring back information about the Virginia Synod we are a part of, in addition to the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America (ELCA). We are Faithful+Bold+Serving, Bishop Humphrey has declared and encouraged of us during his calling as the Bishop of this Synod. We pray for Bob in his retirement, with thanksgiving and wishes for God's peace for him and Barbra.

The end of May and first half of June, we host Grace's Hiker Ministry Monday through Friday in the Fellowship Hall and Youth Room area of the Church. This is the 17th year of Grace's Hiker Ministry, though for three years we have not been able to host due to Covid. It is a joy to continue this long-held and unique ministry at Grace! (We are KNOWN for our Hiker Ministry: in the first two weeks of serving here at Grace, I went to Rockfish Gap Outfitters to have my bicycle repaired, and as I paid for my repairs, seeing checks with a new Virginia address printed below the crossed out old address, the Rockfish Gap employee asked what brought me to Virginia. When I mentioned being pastor at Grace, almost before I could finish the word "Lutheran," the employee cried out "Hiker Hostel!" It is important for a congregation to be known for its ministry in the community around us!)

We also welcome new Council Members in June! Cabell Caister (youth member), Allison Fink, Jerry Kite, Linda Meyer, Jean Morgan (beginning a second term), and Donna Yobs begin their service as our newest Council Members. Please pray for their service to us in leadership at Grace!

We rejoice with our brothers and sisters at Christ Tabernacle Church of God in Christ, who after many months of uncertainty, are the new owners and caretakers of the former Basic United Methodist Church property on Delphine Avenue. Their first worship service will be held Sunday, June 4th in their Basic UMC worship space. Please keep Christ Tabernacle in prayer as they begin to move in and begin renovations on the property. Their official dedication will be later this year, or even in early 2024.

Finally, we celebrate Holy Trinity Sunday on June 4th. The God who has created us and provides for us; the Son, who most clearly shows us the love of God for the world and each of us, so that we can be Christ's Body in this world today; and the Holy Spirit who calls, gathers, enlightens and sanctifies what we do so that we can continue to be "A Community of Servants Sharing in the Word and Work of Jesus..."

Project Esperanza Fund Drive - Last year, Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church and Christ Tabernacle Church of God in Christ worked together to donate \$5520 to Project Esperanza. This year, our goal is to raise \$6000, enough money to support ten deserving students for a full year. We are already halfway to that goal, thanks to a \$2000 pledge from the Grace Endowment Fund and a \$1000 pledge from an anonymous donor. The Grace/COGIC Christian Coalition for Equity and Justice and the Grace All God's Children groups are sponsoring this fund drive but invite all members and friends of the two congregations to contribute.

Grace members can contribute directly to the Church, noting the money is contributed in support of Project Esperanza as a memo. We will collect funds throughout June and July, with the fund drive ending on August 3, 2023.

The mission of Project Esperanza is to form a global community focused on creating positive change and a sustainable future for Haitian refugee and immigrant youths in the Dominican Republic through education and empowerment. For the past 16 years, Project Esperanza has served the Haitian refugee and immigrant population of Puerto Plata, Dominican Republic in the areas of education, social aid, and community development. The project runs two schools serving 275 Haitian immigrant children in the DR. It also provides housing, food, and family structure for a group of vulnerable youth and young adults. In collaboration with two universities, the project provides small business grants and loans to promote artistic training and a pathway to sales for the population it serves.

Grace on the "ground floor" - Grace has been working with other local congregations to establish an Assistance Ministry that helps all Waynesboro congregations to pool their resources to:

- Better help local people and families in crisis with rent and other assistance
- Have one place where people in need can go, rather than "shop" all the churches
- Establish a database so as many people as possible are helped, with no duplication of services
- Offer casework services to families so they can receive the help they need to move from living in crisis to functional living more able to focus on children and the more routine challenges of daily life.

Grace Council on May 16th approved our congregation as a "charter member" of this Assistance Ministry. We will be a part of putting together the policies on how the fund is used. Currently approximately 10 other congregations have expressed interest, with the hope that we continue to grow the number of participating churches. Please pray for this Ministry, and getting it up and running as soon as possible, as the need is great!

The All God's Children anti-racism book group is taking the summer off! Our last meeting will be on **Monday, June 5th** at 7:00 pm in the Grace conference room. We will discuss chapters IV (Hate) and V (Love) of *Jesus and the Disinherited* by Howard Thurman.

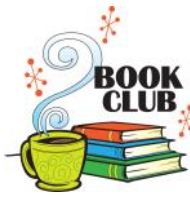
We will resume meeting on the 2nd and 4th Mondays of every month (same time, same place) on **Monday, September 11th** and discuss Tony Morrison's only short story, *Recitatif* (including the 2022 Introduction by Zadie Smith). The story concerns two girls, Twyla and Roberta, one is Black and the other white. However, the author never reveals which one is Black and which one is white. The reader must decide, leading to the moral lesson that racial differences are arbitrary and may be constructed according to one's own personal prejudices and biases. Come prepared to assign races to Twyla and Roberta, including your reasons for that assignment.

Through the summer, members are asked to preview potential sources for future discussions and experiences. These can include books, articles, events, movies, programs, web- or pod-casts, field trips, guest speakers or anything that deepens our understanding of racial equity and justice in the world. We plan to map out an agenda for the next year at the September 11th meeting

School Backpack Ministry—The food backpack program for 2022-2023 school year finished on May 17th. Grace members have helped pack the food bags twice a month. Grace and St. John's Catholic work together on this ministry packing food for William Perry and Wenonah Elementary Schools. Approximately 4,500 bags of food have been packed this year. A food bag is sent home with some students each Friday. The bags contain a variety of foods such as peanut butter, cereal, canned beans, fruits, peas, carrots, dried beans, rice and canned tuna or chicken. Each week the students receive at least 6 items in the bag. Thank you to the many volunteers from Grace who help with this ministry.



Our **Women's Book Group** has met for the last time until next September. During the summer we will explore new books to enjoy when we resume our meetings September-May. We meet every 3rd Wednesday at 11:30 a.m., at Silk Road, to discuss, eat, and socialize. Everyone is welcome. The list of books being considered can be obtained from Kathy Bump.

Food Pantries - Thanks, and Continuing Need—Many thanks to those who have donated Peanut Butter, Mac ‘n Cheese, Personal Hygiene items, and Dried Rice and Beans to our local food pantries. We have made ***thirty-three deliveries*** thus far, fifteen to Main Street United Methodist, and eighteen to Calvary United Methodist, Stuarts Draft, with the donations gratefully received in the midst of great need. **Overall, we have given well over 3,570 pounds of food!** If you can help, please donate to our box set inside the office door for you to drop off.



Our “Ongoing Need for Prayer for Relatives/ Friends” – A continuing part of our Prayers during worship involves our prayer for relatives and friends, as well as for Grace members. We know the importance of continued prayer, especially as those we love and care for face longer term illness and recoveries. We *also* want to be sure that we can continue to add the names of all friends and relatives who are in need of prayer, and include this list during Sunday prayer. Therefore, we will begin a new policy of keeping “Ongoing Needs for Prayer” *for 3 months*, and then removing the names (*unless by request for names to remain on the list longer*).



Mission Endowment Fund Awards!

10. 3R's (Raising Resources for Readers, bringing reading materials to local children) - \$1500
11. Society of St. Andrews (a gleaning ministry that supplies fresh picked food to local food banks) - \$500
12. Boys and Girls Club of Waynesboro, Staunton and Augusta - \$500
13. Waynesboro Ecumenical Assistance Fund (see article in newsletter/bulletin)- \$4000

The Grace Fund, Alleviating Hunger, Social Ministry and Disaster Relief Funds were used; money remains in our Missionary Support, Christian Education and Music Ministry funds. Thanks to all who submitted projects for support this year!

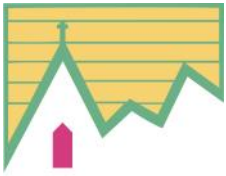
