## From the Pastor

#### Pastor's Page –

The Season of Lent has long been considered a time of Spiritual Discipline. In the days of the early Church, the final preparation for Baptism was a time of

*Catechesis* -- where our word Catechism comes from – and it occurred during the Season of Lent. Intentional Prayer, Fasting, Scripture reading, and Mentoring by fellow Christians was expected. It was a time of *Spiritual Discipline* before being washed by water and God's Word and Spirit, and entering into the life of Christ's Body, the Church.

Over the last few months, I have heard many people talk about new Disciplines that they have undertaken. One couple have greatly reduced their intake of sugars and carbohydrates, are much more disciplined in their eating habits, and have discovered how much better they feel, to say nothing of their losing weight. Still others have become much more disciplined in their spending, reducing credit card debt, not indulging in purchasing "wants," and have discovered how less stressful their lives are. And because of medical problems, others have changed diet, added exercise and ended long term "habits" and as a result have been able to do things they haven't been able to do in years, much to their delight.

What might begin as a negative (Stop smoking! No more desserts! You don't need that! You have to exercise 15 minutes a day!) comes to be seen as the benefit to life that entering into a discipline is.

This Lenten Season, I'd like to invite you into a specific discipline, and to make a Covenant to join me. One of the things I've observed in my own life is how easily distracted our electronic age can make me. News outlets and radio shows incessantly tell me what is wrong, or what can make things right to fix what is wrong in the world today. Computer algorithms analyze where I've surfed on the web in the past, and put up any number of articles and suggested topics that get my attention, and suddenly I've clicked on an article that I never intended to read in the first place. The "ding" or buzz that is programmed in my phone to go off whenever I receive a text, a Facebook post or an ESPN score turns me into "Pavlov's dog", tempting my hand to go automatically to my device to receive the newest message. The patter of a TV in the background can be fairly easily heard in a number of our homes.

Let's make a tithe of our time spent on electronic devices – TV, computer, tablet, cell phone – turn them OFF, and Covenant to a Discipline of Scripture Reading, Devotion, and Prayer with our God who desires "Life that really is Life" (I Timothy 6:19) for each one of us. If you watch 3 hours, for example, of TV each day - or surfing the net, or looking at Facebook, or listening to talk radio, CNN, Fox News, NPR, or other news outlet - then tithe 18 minutes (one tenth of 180 minutes) each day letting God have your attention, your ear, and your senses. Enter into a disciplined reading of scripture (or find a recorded version) using a daily lectionary (we'll provide a lectionary for Lent located next to the Covenant Sign up Sheet); use The Message Bible paraphrase to hear the Word in a fresh new way. Take the prayer list from Sunday's bulletin,

and think about the people and situations (and God's Mission for Grace) as you bring them before God, and ask for God to hear your prayer. Pick up a "Christ in our Home" devotional and read the scripture and the devotion for each day. Attend Wednesday ecumenical lunch/worship or evening soup supper/worship as a part of your tithe of Lenten discipline on those days.

C.S. Lewis writes the following: "The New Testament has lots to say about self-denial, but not about self-denial as an end to itself. We are told to deny ourselves and take up our crosses in order that we may follow Christ; and nearly every description of what we shall ultimately find if we do so contains an appeal to desire... if we consider the unblushing promises of reward and the staggering nature of the rewards promised in the Gospels, it would seem that our Lord finds our desires, not too strong, but too weak. We are half-hearted creatures, fooling about with drink and sex and ambition *and* other distractions? when infinite jov is offered us, like an ignorant child who wants to go on making mud pies in a slum because he cannot imagine what is meant by the offer of a holiday at the sea. We are far too easily pleased." (from the Weight of Glory, by C.S. Lewis)

Look for the Covenant Sign-Up in the narthex (back) of the worship space, and join me for this Lenten Discipline. And look for the benefits that God promises as we follow our Lord Jesus to the cross and beyond.

The Season of Lent since the earliest years of the Church has been a time of preparation and discipline; a time of deepening one's faith in the One who lived, died and rose again, so that each of us, and the whole world (John 3:16-17) might truly live. There is a whole range of activities, from an exercise of Lenten discipline, to Worship, to Lunch or Supper Fellowship. Come and join in the Season of Lent at Grace!

**Lenten Covenant:** Make a commitment to give a tithe of the time you spend on your tablet, phone, computer, TV, or other electronic device to spend time in prayer, in reading God's Word, or a time of devotion. Example: If you're on Facebook or other social media, and/or watching TV, and/or streaming/surfing the web three hours per day (180 minutes), you'll commit to 18 minutes per day in prayer, scripture reading or devotions. This will be a Covenant Sign-Up where all who want to be a part will make a covenant to each other to engage in this Lenten commitment. Look in early March on Grace's webpage for resources to help.

Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper and Palm Burning at Bethlehem -Tuesday, March 5th, 5:00 p.m. - 7:00 p.m. - This many-year tradition is an invitation for Grace to enjoy Bethlehem's Pancake Supper, and to prepare for Ash Wednesday with the burning of the previous year's Palms to be used as the Ashes for Ash Wednesday. Free will offering for the supper will be given 80% to WARM (Waynesboro Area Refuge Ministry) and 20% to Bethlehem.
