Pastor's Page



As we begin the Season of Lent, we must once again be reminded that Christ's journey to the cross was for the sake of the world. You and me, yes, but for the sake of the whole World. As we have

noted countless times, it's on the wall of our worship space – God so loved the World...

That love, which we so often speak about in personal ways, about the ways in which we have experienced God's forgiveness, or God's blessing, can be seen in the World around us.

We are preparing to embark on a journey in which we will experience this locally, as we prepare to receive an Afghan family in partnership with Westminster Presbyterian Church. They are strangers, "aliens in this land," to use a biblical phrase, and showing hospitality to them, helping them to make their way is a powerful way that we can show God's love where we live. Pastor Linda Kusse-Wolfe, who retired a couple of years ago from Main Street United Methodist Church, recently shared her experience traveling to Athens, Greece, to help teach English to refugees from places across the Middle East. Pastor Kusse-Wolfe spent three years in Iran with Persian Christians, learned to speak Farsi, a common language in the area, and also learned the peril so many people in that area of the world have experienced. She spent almost a month with a Persian Christian ministry in Athens who helps refugees who have come through Greece to begin to learn English and help with basic needs, and so much more.

We can have a surface-view of these things. We can hear stories of "refugees from the Middle East" trying to arrive in boats off the coast of Greece, or being stopped at the borders of Poland or Hungary, and see it as a "problem," something far removed from us, or what "those people" are trying to do. It becomes important to hear the stories people like Pastor Kusse-Wolfe tell, who went into the rougher parts of Athens (a cab driver told her "what are even thinking coming to this area of the city?!" and driving off quickly after she exited the cab), and found...well, she found two things: unspeakable hardship of people who, because their lives were threatened because of their faith (whether Christian, or even a different type of Islam which is not the type of those in power), or because of their opposition to the Taliban, to name a few), spent their life-savings on traffickers who helped them escape, because they could not exit their country by the very limited legal ways to escape. In Greece, these traffickers enslave men, women and children. They force them into places to rent where they have no means to pay, and then force them into the sex trade. That's the first part. The second part is the nearly impossible thing Pastor Kusse-Wolfe also experienced. The sheer joy and love that a very brave Persian Christian community in this terrible part of town offers to these refugees: food, health care, respect, a place of peace, and a means to escape. And perhaps most importantly, the love of Jesus. Given to Christians, Muslims, it does not matter. All are welcome. There is hope more powerful than the hopelessness they would otherwise be trapped in.

In Harrisonburg, Pastor Kusse-Wolfe teaches English to Afghan women who have made their way to the U.S., through the massive airlift we all witnessed via TV and other media late last year. The women there tell harrowing stories. A husband shot dead in the woman's presence. A single mom who has experienced unspeakable things. A 40 year-old Christian convert whose life was in true peril. Who knows what our family will have experienced. Their trauma may be a part of the challenges we might have in sponsorship (we don't know who are family will be yet). Who are we to be to them? What are we to share? Resources, time, energy, yes. Our prayers for them, yes. Yet this Lenten journey we are about to embark upon reminds us of something much deeper. God so loved the World that he sent his only Son. In a very real way, like the Persian Christian community deep in the most dangerous part of Athens, Greece, we have the opportunity to offer love. And through that experience, to recognize with new eyes of faith just how important this love is in every part of our lives.

Church **Highlights of Congregation Council** February 15, 2022

Linda Meyer reported on the Afghan Family resettlement program. Westminster Presbyterian Church is looking into converting their manse back into a house configuration to potentially house an Afghan refuge family and is looking for help and assistance with house furnishings, transportation, health care, employment etc.. Grace already has 20+ members willing to volunteer for this project.

Ron Almarode reported that \$27,656 was spent, and \$27,586 was collected, leaving a \$70 surplus. He stated that things were really just fine financially.

President Crowder reported that the GELC Coronavirus Committee met and he stated that the committee's decisions will be based on science. The Coronavirus Committee will meet monthly for the foreseeable future.

Strategic plan update: Temple Talks will continue and the committee is still gathering data.

Sabbatical Update-Each supply pastor will work 8 hours per week, Pastor Pingel asked the Council what are those 8 hours about—teaching, visiting, preachings etc.. Robin Crowder suggests forming a sabbatical Committee, we need folks to step up and volunteer to serve.

Columbarium Debt Campaign 2022- We currently owe \$23K on the loan, we could work on starting this campaign later this Spring.

Insurance Review- we will be getting 2 additional insurance bids on the overall GELC insurance package to compare with what we are currently spending to see if these is room for any savings.

Council recruiting for next year 2022-2023. Council nominating committee will put together a comprehensive list at the next Council meeting.

The Mission Endowment Fund percentage was approved. The Mission Endowment Fund Committee recommend a withdrawal of 4.5 percent of the total Mission Endowment holdings, and council voted to approve.

COVID-19 Recommendations and Practices at Grace

Since early in the pandemic, a committee of members and congregation leaders have met periodically with Pastor Pingel to assess the current status of the pandemic in our community; and, to make recommendations to the Congregation Council on best practices to maintain the health and safety of the congregation and community while maintaining our faith practices of worship, service, and fellowship. The committee met again on February 15 to assess the community prevalence of the virus and to update these recommendations. The following decisions were recommended and approved by Congregation Council later the same day.

We will continue to keep our current masking protocols in place, based on doctor recommendations, considering the ages and vulnerabilities of our membership, the desire to bear with one another and be good neighbors to all who attend.

This is in keeping with our policy from last year of using the level of 5-10% PCR (percentage of positive COVID cases in the community as measured by Augusta Health) as our goal level of resuming in-person group activities at Grace or changing our practices for meeting in person. We are currently bending that protocol by continuing to offer in-person worship, though we are working to mitigate the risks of that by continuing to mask, social distance, and modifying the air handling in the sanctuary (last year's project). The current PCR numbers for the community are at 30-40%, so we believe (a) caution is still necessary, and (b) we are following Augusta Health, state VDH) and CDC recommendations in staying with our current practices.

These practices hold for Grace activities as well as for any other groups Who use the Grace facilities.

Hymnals and pew Bibles will be returned to the pews.

Lenten activities and Easter—Given the recommendations of our physician members and other medical members, we will not be offering Soup Suppers before the Wednesday Lenten worship services at Grace.

We will have a sign-up process and recommended maximum attendance for each Easter service (much like we did at Christmas), with a "all are included" policy if we have walk-ins that push us above our named numerical maximum. We will not offer the traditional Easter breakfast.

Church Office – Nancy Dowdy will not be required to mask in her own office; but, she will mask if she needs to tend to matters where she'll be in contact with others.

At the April 2nd Memorial Service for Ty Elliott, a funeral luncheon Following worship will be provided ONLY for the family and friends, as the family is all from out of town.

Choir - The Committee decided that the time was too soon to allow for non-masked rehearsals and singing by the whole choir.

The Committee and Council are aware that these decisions will bring relief to some members and will make other members unhappy. These are difficult times and each of these decisions was made with prayer and great concern for all members of Grace and the community in which we live. The Committee will continue to meet monthly before each Council meeting to reassess the situation and to update recommendations. They will meet sooner than one month if conditions change significantly and require changes more quickly. In addition, the congregation will be kept informed of discussions and changes to practices as quickly as possible after each meeting.
