#### From the Pastor



#### Pastor's Page

Near the end of February, I was invited to be part of an informational Zoom about some big changes that are now taking place in

our community.

You may recall during the first two years of Covid, numerous government-sponsored efforts took place to make sure that no-one in our nation would go hungry, and that those who earned among the least in our nation would not go homeless by receiving a number of tax incentives that would reduce their tax burden, and allow them to afford their housing during a very uncertain time in our nation's history.

Among the presenters at this Zoom were many representatives of local organizations like Social Services (Grace member Amber Bokelman is Assistant Director in Benefit Programs and was a primary presenter), United Way, Community Action, and other groups, who reported that as of February, benefits like SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) were being cut to pre-Covid levels, meaning a loss of almost \$900/year/family in food benefits. Various tax incentive programs, designed to help families earning less than \$25,000/year, are also concluding in 2023, meaning a loss of approximately \$2,000 - \$6,000 per family in incentives.

What this means for Churches is we are expecting a great increase in the need for food, and also requests for housing assistance, utilities, etc. I also learned the complexities of finding out who offers what assistance in our area. Though there are some genuine efforts to try to "row in the same direction" to help those in need in our area, often someone who is in need of assistance has to work with two, three, or more organizations to find the help they need. There IS a

homelessness response program in our area that puts people in need in touch with a case worker who will respond in a day or two. At the same time, it can take weeks to receive the assistance a person or family needs.

Why mention this during the Season of Lent here at Grace? First, to remind us that for many people, the Church remains one of the first places people look for assistance. Second, to remind us that ongoing efforts at Grace, like our support of two food banks - Main Street United Methodist, Wavnesboro, and Calvary United Methodist, Stuarts Draft - will continue to be critical in the weeks and months ahead. "You are salt and light for the world," Jesus tells us, and as we will here later on this vear, Jesus also reminds us, "whenever you do this to the least of these my brothers and sisters, you do it unto me." (Matthew 25) Our call is to offer hope in hopeless times.

The third reason is to let you know that many local congregations – including Grace – are looking more deeply into housing and homelessness in our area. I will be working with other local pastors and congregations, as well as being in contact with local organizations, to see what ways we in the local

Church can help with resources, but also in some way help to create a more transparent, accountable, and efficient way to help those who find themselves in difficult places this year because of loss of income. (I know if I suddenly lost \$2000 - \$3000 in income, it would certainly affect my own finances and stability! Imagine if you suddenly lost 5-10% of your yearly income.)

Please pray for those affected by these changes that are upon them (and us) here and now. Pray for people like Amber Bokelman and many others in Social Services, United Way, Community Action, Augusta Health, and many other organizations on the front lines of meeting the challenges of those in need in our community. And pray for Christ's Church, as we seek to "do to others" as we would do to Jesus, in this time we follow Jesus to the cross, and new life.





The "First Sunday Fellowships" have begun! Each "first Sunday" of the month, one of our volunteer groups at Grace will hold a gathering in the Fellowship Hall after worship. There will be the opportunity for the groups to explain what their group does, who is involved, answer questions, and have fellowship and a few light refreshments. #### The Season of Lent

The ancient practice of Lent was preparing candidates for Holy Baptism, by walking them through the life of Jesus, from Ash Wednesday through Easter. This preparation reviewed Jesus' life, his triumphant entry into Jerusalem, followed by his death on the cross, and his rising to new life. It anticipates our life in Christ, where each day we die to sin, and rise to the new life the Risen Christ has for us.

#### Wednesdays in Lent - "The Apocrypha - The Story of You"

Apocrypha is considered a part of Holy Scripture in the Roman Catholic and Orthodox churches, but we know little of it in the Lutheran and other Protestant Churches. During this Lenten Season, we'll take a look at our Faith Story - "The Story of You"- through the lens of the Apocrypha. The books of the Apocrypha were written in the period of history between the Old and New Testament. They contain Prayers, Wisdom Literature, Short (and sometimes wild!) Stories, as well as "straight up" History. We'll discover that this collection of sacred documents "off the beaten path" can be a strong aid to our own baptismal journeys of faith; "the story of you" on the way to the cross, the tomb, and the resurrection of our Lord.
