Pastor's Page

First, some Holy Week Notes, since Holy Week, and Easter, will all be in the month of March:

- Palm Sunday This year, we will NOT read the full Passion Gospel on March; our gospel that day will be Mark 11:1-11, which we will hear at the beginning of the service. We'll continue our tradition of gathering with many of our neighbors in Christ from a number of congregations, hearing the gospel, and then process with our Hosanna's! into the worship space.
- Hosanna! Is a powerful word to begin Holy Week. Often we think of it as a sacred word of praise, in the same vein as Hallelujiah! This is NOT THE CASE, however! Hosanna! Is a Hebrew word that is made up of the two words Hos (yasha) and anna, the first word meaning

"deliver" or "save," and the second meaning "beg," or "beseech." "Please deliver us!" or "I beg you to save!" are the words to begin Holy Week. It is confession, and yet it is hope in Jesus, that we are delivered, saved, not only once, but every day in our Baptism into Jesus' death and resurrection!

- Maundy Thursday We join the disciples and Jesus in the upper room; Footwashing, Holy Communion, and Forgiveness are a part of worship on this first worship service of the Great Three Days, as is the Stripping of the Altar.
- Good Friday It is here that we hear the Passion of our Lord in its fullness. This year, Pastor Mark Radecke shares his gift of telling Mark's Gospel story of Jesus' Passion from memory. This powerful telling, and our prayers before the Cross, lead us to the heart of our Salvation story.

• Easter Vigil — Meeting at sundown, which is traditionally the beginning of the new day in the Hebrew tradition, we tell stories of God's deliverance and salvation. And then we discover that God's deliverance and salvation is not only historical, but present today in the crucified and risen Jesus!

Then Easter, **the Resurrection of our Lord**, is Sunday, March 31st. There are THREE opportunities to celebrate the Resurrection:

- Christ Tabernacle Church of God in Christ has welcomed us to a Sunrise Service on the front lawn of Fairfax Hall, across from their church building. We'll meet at 6:45am to greet the dawning of our salvation!
- We celebrate The Resurrection of our Lord at our traditional times of 8:30am and 11:00am.
- We enjoy Easter Breakfast together between the services – fellowship and joy together on this Day of Days!

Grace Youth – Come and support our Youth on Friday, *March 1st* for a

We gather at 2pm, *March 10th* at Calvary for the event, joining our friends at First Baptist, Westminster Pres, St. John the Evangelist, and St. John Episcopal!

Finally, two things: I lead *Vespers at Summit Square* on a semi-regular basis, with the next service, Sunday, March 3rd at 3:30pm. We'll share in Holy Communion. Many Grace members are residents at Summit Square, and we celebrate in the Chapel on the 2nd floor.

Please also pray for a *Blue Ridge Partnership* gathering of Southern Valley Conference pastors (Grace is a part of this conference, and I am Dean of the conference) and Southern Conference (Roanoke area) pastors for a meeting with the Bishop's staff, which will occur Tuesday, March 12th in Roanoke.

In our Worship and in our use of time, talent, and resources as we are Sent into the world, we follow our Lord Jesus, who has answered our Hosanna's! and each day in our Baptism into Christ, saves, delivers and makes us a part of what God is doing in this world! God guide your Lenten and Holy Week journey.





Synod Assembly is in April - *Online!* - The Virginia Synod Assembly is a yearly event in which we learn about the Ministry of our Synod. We also learn about the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and tend to necessary business - such as electing delegates to the ELCA Churchwide Assembly in 2025.
