## From the Pastor

### Pastor's Page

At the Gathering of the Ministerium this past week, I was asked to take part in a simple exercise. We were asked to get a person sitting next to us, and

answer three simple questions:

Think about the times in your life when you became more conscious of the fact that Jesus really loves you.

Who are three persons who made that come to life for you?

How did they do it?

The presenter, Rev. Dave Daubert (who came to Grace about 7 years ago to help us with our Mission statement and giving voice to our purpose as a congregation) gave an example in his life: he was a kid in college and had two friends who he'd play flag football with,

study with, go to the dining hall with, etc. But every Saturday afternoon at 4:30, they would stop their playing, and head off to Roman Catholic Mass held at the Catholic Center. They'd invite him to come, this kid who never grew up in the Church. He'd ask them why they'd stop their game and go to Mass. And they said that it mattered to them to hear about God's love for them through Jesus Christ. Enough to stop what they were doing each week to attend worship. Plus they could sleep in on Sunday! After they invited him the fifteenth time (literally), he said yes. And he credits their invitation as changing his life, because otherwise he wouldn't have discovered the love of Jesus that indeed has made his whole life completely different from the path he had been on until then. (And not just because he's a pastor!)

My experience of those who taught me

the love of Jesus in my earlier years came from being a part of a family that was at worship regularly, Sunday School, youth group, etc.

I can talk about learning how Jesus really loves me from my mother, who took seriously Martin Luther's admonishment that parents are the most important pastors a child will ever have. But it was not only in the family that I learned of Jesus' love.

I learned from Mrs. Grabb in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade Sunday School how much Jesus loved me, and remember even now how she radiated God's love, and how she made the stories of Jesus come alive.

I remember Rudy and Anne Yobs at Lutheran Church of the Redeemer, Atlanta, back in the late 1970's and 1980's – among many others – who, as a young adult a long way from home attending college, made me feel welcome, asked about my life, modeled service in the Church, and shared how Jesus' love made a difference in their lives.

And maybe this is the most important thing to say - I continue to learn from others about Jesus' love for me, and all the world - from members of Grace; from people in this community of Waynesboro, Augusta County and the surrounding area. It is a Present Tense "thing;" I learned of Jesus' love for me

from my friends and colleagues in the Waynesboro pastor's group I was on retreat with this past weekend, as we talked not only about working together, but supporting each other along the way with prayer, and sharing our stories.

Dave Daubert's presentations these past few days made me realize how important it is for us to practice telling our faith stories. Jesus, in Matthew's gospel, tells us to go and make disciples. You and me. That's our Great Commission. That's our reason for being.

We heard some grim statistics about the ELCA while at the Ministerium. At 3.4 million members, we are 1.8 million people smaller than 20 years ago. Some people say by 2050, the ELCA will number in the hundreds of thousands, if that. Some reasons why? The average ELCA member invites someone to worship once every 23 years. And our denomination – and this next fact is a huge irony, because the Reformation was in large part begun because Martin Luther REDISCOVERED JESUS – has largely forgotten how to regularly ask ourselves – and to share our answers – of how we know that Jesus loves us, and to share the stories of those who helped us to realize this. Because this is Jesus' call, to be witnesses to the gospel; Ambassadors for Christ, the apostle Paul calls us.

So that's our call together as Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church. We can be known for many things: what we've done in the community, our beautiful building, a 126 year history, the friendships and fellowship we have here as a family of Christ. And yet most of all, we have a purpose, to share in the word and work of Jesus. We have a story to tell; the old, old story of Jesus and his love. Except it's not just an old, old story; it HAS TO BE a present tense story as well, for the

Gospel to continue to be known, through Grace, through you, and through me. We exist for this reason at Grace. So, ask someone at Grace over the next few weeks, to share a story of someone who helped them to know Jesus' love. And do the same for them; so we can practice in order to share that gospel in the lives that Jesus, in love, have given us to live.

## Highlights of Congregation Council Meeting October 15, 2019

Pastor was asked to be a part of an ELCA Coaching Seminar designed to help congregations and/or individuals to set up achievable goals and determine the steps that a person or group is willing to invest to achieve those goals. It's our prayer that this can be of help to us at Grace as we look to God's future for us.

There were meaningful community activities that Grace was involved in through the CROP Walk and the Ecumenical Animal Blessing. Concern was expressed about the low attendance at worship and other activities in which Grace is a part. What does this mean for Grace? Part of our future that is in God's Hands does involve our participation.

Pumpkins with the Pastor will be held October 27 with a Octoberfest meal and pumpkin decorating with prizes and games. Fun and fellowship for everyone.


