#### **Pastor's Page**

Draw a line from Grottoes to Weyers Cave. Actually, it's State Route 256, goes past the Shenandoah Regional Airport.

Then, draw a line from Grottoes to Waynesboro, which is U.S. 340, and do the same from Weyers Cave to Staunton, which is Interstate 81.

Finally, draw a line from Waynesboro to Staunton, which is Interstate 64. That "box" is about 'the size of the Gaza Strip, containing well over 2 million people. 140 square miles. Augusta County, which is seven times the size of the Gaza Strip (at 971 sq. mi.), has 76,000 people.

In this month of November, as followers of Jesus Christ living in America, we are preparing for many things. Soon comes a time of Thanksgiving. There's an excellent historical book called <u>Mayflower</u> by Nathaniel Philbrick which chronicles the arrival of the Plymouth Colony on the shores of what is now Massachusetts. In desperate times, two very different people – settlers from England and indigenous people gathered for a feast. And for fifty-five years, these peoples chose peace and dialogue over war and conflict as they lived in proximity; until the desire for power and retribution changed things, which continues to be a default of our American history with indigenous peoples.

Within a few days of our celebration of Thanksgiving, the Church celebrates Christ the King Sunday. This year, we will read the gospel of Matthew (chapter 25:31ff), and Jesus' magnificent story of "the Son of Man coming in his glory and all the angels with him... I was hungry and you fed me, thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, sick and you took care of me, in prison and you visited me." It is a very different vision, but amazingly, one in which the Kingdom is given to those who love, and give, and welcome, and show mercy, and forgive.

The story of Israel and the Palestinians is a story as old as humanity, and yet repeated over and over again. Even now, there are diplomats and generals gathering and deciding: *Can we save lives? Will we look weak?* And clamors for retribution, for "destroying Hamas," for "destroying Israel..." And a few voices who are asking, *is it possible there is another way?* 

It helps me to look at the reality of this tiny strip of land which is a blip on the way to Harrisonburg, a few news stories or songs on the radio, on the way from Waynesboro to Staunton. Honestly, if there's two million people, where do you move when the leaflets from the sky tell you to escape the bombings that you 24 hours to "go to safety?"

A Palestinian-American scholar said on the news the other day that one of the challenges is for Israeli's, for Americans, for the world, to view Palestinians as NOT "less than." In a very real way, Jesus' vision of the fullness of time when the Son of Man comes shows the Son of Man and his angels very interested in how we treat "the least of these who are members of my family."

The amazing Good News of the gospel of Jesus Christ is that our King – Christ the King – when he brought the Kingdom of Heaven near (Matthew 4:17), is that he declared another Way, which involves daily dying and rising; dying to ways in which we keep on plotting to "win the long game" by killing, kidnapping, raping, and sowing panic; or by pulverizing 140 sq. miles into nothingness. *Or the ways in our daily lives we choose another King instead*  *of Jesus* and ignore, or accept the status quo of "the least of these."

For at least awhile in our American story, the English settlers – who found themselves "the least of these," in their starvation and lack of shelter – found food and shelter – found life! – in the native Americans who "inasmuch as you did it to the least of these, you did it to me." Yes, there were treaties and "loyalty oaths" to the king of England, and bargaining, and other stuff mixed up in it all – God always works in the mess of it all! – but somehow Christ the King and his message "with all the angels" became present in "Thanksgiving."

Pray for the peace of God which passes all understanding in the Gaza Strip, in Israel. And in your daily lives. I hope you will come and worship November 19<sup>th</sup> at Christ Tabernacle as a sign of our unity in Christ, and as Christ our King, all of us, together. We need that King more than any other in this World that He so loves.

#### December 4 – 11, 2023 Grace ELC-WARM Cold Weather Shelter

The WARM Cold Weather Shelter (CWS) is scheduled to run for 20 consecutive weeks from the week of Thanksgiving to Easter. WARM's goal is to provide shelter/food for **up to 40 guests** each night November 20 – December 31; and to provide for **up to 70-80 guests** each night January 1 – March 31! The need is tremendous. And because of this increase, several things will change.

Grace will host up to 20 guests downstairs in our Fellowship Hall December  $4 - 11^{\text{th};}$  another church will provide for an additional 20 guests that same week. And, Grace may assist later in the winter (2024)by providing meals and supplies while guests are Sheltered at (2025) EXPO.

**We need your support and help!** Please keep this important ministry (and our guests) in your prayers. And please, find a volunteer opportunity that fits you. We had almost 50 different volunteers from Grace assist with each week we hosted last year – and **we need you again this year**!

**November, we will collect supplies for the CWS.** We will have a box located on the back table of the Nave. If you prefer, leave bags/boxes of supplies downstairs on the Kitchen counter. Please help us stock up!

**Collecting Toiletries:** travel/hotel sized shampoo/conditioner, soap, toothbrushes/toothpaste, lotion, combs, disposable razors

**Collecting Breakfast/Snack Food Items:** cereal, fruit cups, soft nutra-grain bars, fruit juice boxes, nabs, individual-portion bags of chips/cookies.

In December, we'll ask for fresh fruit.

#### Volunteer Opportunities – December 3 – 11, 2023

**Set-Up/Breakdown Teams:** December 3, after church for one (1) hour; to set-up Fellowship Hall – put away round tables, sweep floors, (2) set out long tables and chairs. December 11 – help put things back!

**Set-Up Team:** December 4 around 8:00 a.m. – 9:00 a.m. to meet WARM volunteers/guests and assist with cots and finalizing Fellowship Hall set-up for Fire Marshall inspection.

**Check-In Team:** Three (3) - four (4) volunteers/night, 5:30 – 7:00 p.m.; to assist WARM Staff Host and welcome guests – say hello, explain/show church set-up, let them know we care, participate in time of fellowship, make coffee. Eat Dinner!

**Shower Host:** One (1) volunteer/night 5:30 – 8:00 p.m.; guests can sign-up at Check-in for a shower – call guests at shower time, offer toiletries on table and towel, monitor shower schedule and collect towels in hamper. If time, start a load of laundry. And we'll rotate volunteers so you can eat dinner, too!

**Meal Teams:** One (1) team/night, time commitments vary per tasks/teams. Join a team to provide dinner for up to 20 guests and up to 10 volunteers; we need people to provide meal supplies, prepare food, serve dinner, and/or clean-up the kitchen.

We provide dinner each evening, breakfast and sack lunches the following day. We already have seven (7) Meal Teams lined up for December – additional volunteers are always welcome!

**Overnight Hosts:** Two (2) volunteers/night, 8:00 p.m. – 8:00 a.m., invited to come early to join us for dinner! Assist WARM Staff Host overnight as needed; prepare 20 sack lunches for next day; 10:00 p.m.—lights out. In morning, 5:30 a.m., make coffee, put out breakfast foods and sack lunches/fruit/water. Guests leave by 7:00 a.m. Ensure Fellowship Hall/Kitchen are clean, all food items are put away.

**Clean-Up Teams:** One (1) - two (2) volunteers/day, time is flexible between 7:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. – no guests are present. Check Fellowship Hall and Kitchen – sweep, clean-up as needed; Lysol bathrooms/showers – restock; wash/dry/fold towels. Wash/dry/fold sheets for Overnight Host cots. Check food – restock as needed.

Dear Pastor Pingle and President Crowder,

It is with humility and gratitude that I write to you both about the \$2,500 donation from your Mission Endowment Fund given for the poorest of the poor in La Gonave, Haiti. Your donation caps off our \$24,000 first of five year goal which now provides the funding of the Medical Clinic in the village of Sous á Philippe.

The clinic opened its doors as a full time, five day a week medical clinic, staffed by all Haitian healthcare personnel, on May 8, 2023. The context of this is that the clinic building had stood mostly empty for over 20 years save for the occasional missionary trips to open it for a week or two. I have served as a physician in this clinic on several such trips. It being open daily is unprecedented. They are now seeing about thirty people a week. This is on the south shore of the long island that is in between the two westward peninsulas of Haiti. There is no other medical care on that shore and no easy passage to the north shore where there is care.

The money you sent will be spent on salaries, lab testing equipment, and pharmaceuticals. Imagine, this will be the first time ever that a patient with Diabetes or High Blood Pressure will be able to have a steady week after week supply of medication.

You may also know that I traveled with your very own Steve Van Stee to this same clinic to install four solar panels, batteries, inverter, lights, fans, and wiring in 2019. There is a video about this on our website

featured is a picture of our medical team and a recently treated burn patient.

As Jesus said, "Blessed are those that hunger and thirst for righteousness." This donation is a concrete act of righteousness that moves the ideal of the beloved community that much closer.
