### Pastor's Page

Our name is Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church. I don't know how the name was selected when the congregation organized

in 1893. Maybe someone thought "we are organized by God's Grace through faith in Jesus Christ," taking the apostle Paul's amazing observation from Romans 3:28 – that was also at the heart of Martin Luther's conversion – to heart.

And they would be right. God's Grace is undeserved love, it is freely given, and it is given to you and me.

Think about the worship space we have not been in for awhile, that you may have wandered through like some members have when they have picked up a poinsettia, or a bag of communion chalices for worship via You Tube or Zoom, or after dropping off a bag of food in our Food Pantry bin. The most prominent thing in that space is the cross. Front and center.

We know God's Grace most richly through the One who carried that cross, was nailed to that cross. We know God's Grace through Jesus.

The cross lines us up (justifies you) with God. You'll notice that the cross has one long line, bottom to top. And the cross lines us up (justifies you) with each other, and with our neighbor. That's the line of the cross that goes from left to right.

Every day, Jesus lines me up with God. I start each day, knowing who I am, knowing I am loved, knowing that Jesus' Spirit will guide me. That Grace is simply given to me. So that, when my life:

- lines up with my spouse,
- or lines up with my family,
- or with a member of Grace,
- or with the homeless couple that comes into the church,
- or with a Grace Council meeting
- or in an encounter with a member of Christ Tabernacle

- or when I am shopping
- or when I am doing chores
- or when someone is angry with me, or I am tempted to be angry with someone
- or when I have an opportunity to be a blessing to a stranger
- or when I am relaxing with a book or TV, or hobby...

In other words, when my life lines up with whoever I see, or whatever I do, Jesus and his Spirit are there to make possible life that really is life.

Pastor Aaron Fuller, a military chaplain who served in Virginia for many years, wrote recently in the Living Lutheran magazine: "Sometimes I think it is better for me to know what Jesus does for me rather than to reflect too much on what need to accomplish." I love this statement most of all because it reminds us, to begin this New Year, of something vitally important: God's Grace in Jesus Christ is present tense. Grace is what is happening now.

The beginnings of a New Year, especially 2021 and what we have all experienced in 2020, may uniquely tempt us to unleash a torrent of activity and accomplishment – not realizing that we have already experienced a torrent of thought and emotions (and a lot of *very different activity!*) in 2020! So – in our life together as God's people at Grace, or as individuals who make up the people of Grace – before we *resolve* anything in

2021, we remember our name: Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church: God's Grace that lines us up with Jesus, first, then lines us up with our neighbor, and everyone and everything that is a part of daily life. This is what Jesus does first. Then, life unfolds from there.

## **Highlights of Congregation Council Meetings December 8 & 15, 2020**

A special Church Council meeting was held on **December 8**, **2020** to consider the final budget recommendations of the Church Finance Committee for the year 2021. The Church Council passed the recommended budget for 2021 unanimously, to be presented to the congregation for approval on December 20, 2020.

The Church Council met again on **December 15**, **2020** to conduct its regularly scheduled monthly meeting.

A mixture of good news and bad news was reported concerning Covid-19 virus. As of December 15, 4,450 new cases of Covid-19 had been reported in the SAW reporting area with 50 new deaths. The good news is that the Augusta Medical Center has been approved to receive shipments of Covid-19 anti-virus vaccines. However, until Covid-19 numbers "come down" resumption of in-person worship services have been postponed indefinitely.

Christmas Eve services will be conducted in the parking lot at 4:00 p.m. Twenty two (22) spaces have been allocated for attendees on a first come, first serve basis. As of December 15, 18 spaces have been reserved. At 7:00 p.m., there will be a virtual indoor service. The entire Christmas offering will be donated this year to the Blue Ridge Food Bank.

Even as improvements to the parking lot are continuing, the new parking lot will be dedicated during the December 20<sup>th</sup> virtual service. At the conclusion of which, the proposed financial budget for 2021 will be presented to the congregation for approval.

The YMCA day care is up and operational at Grace. The installation of the four A/C roof top units will be delayed until sometime in the Spring.

Anne Putnam's resignation from the Church Council was accepted with regrets. A replacement for Anne for either a 6 month term or a 6 month and one (1) year term to run from June 2020 to June 2021, is needed. The Council also approved the membership transfers of the Rev, Gordon and Anne Putnam from Grace ELC to St. James Lutheran Church in Fishersville, VA.



**Stand Up and Be Heard**—Each of those in our reading group has committed <u>"to study, prayer and action to become an anti-racist individual in an anti-racist church."</u> Throughout the year, we will act to bring stories, activities, and thoughts to encourage others to make a similar commitment. We invite you to become a part of this journey of love, justice, and equality in Jesus' name.

2020 has been a difficult year with our isolation from one another - especially from our families and our faith families. However, we

have not been alone, Jesus has walked with us in the garden, on the roads we have traveled, at our jobs, and in our homes.

or those of us who have come together on Zoom to discuss the books we have read and to share our thoughts with African-American members of Christ Tabernacle, we have heard the Lord's spirit and words urging us - to stand up and be heard in order to advocate for a better world - one without racism.

We continually ask ourselves how we can do this, what can we as individuals and as a congregation do to improve our little corner of the world. We prayed, read and talked together, explored resources available, spoke to the congregation in temple talks and forums this summer, and shared with all the 1993 ELCA Statement on Race.

Jesus was a revolutionary figure in his day. He came to change the world, to do away with favoritism as he told us to love one another unconditionally and to love our neighbors as ourselves. He taught peace and love and gave us the tools to achieve them and the Spirit to guide us. It is God's Work, Our Hands that must work to achieve the peace and love we desire.

As children, we sang that we should let our light shine, not hide it under a bushel. As adults, that light still burns as we stand up for the truths of our faith. So in this new year we ask the Lord to help and guide our congregation to examine our individual and collective biases and make a difference in our community.

#### **WARM Cold Weather Shelter**

The past few years Grace has hosted the WARM Cold Weather Shelter in the fellowship hall for a week. Due Waynesboro Area Refuge Ministry to COVID, the shelter has been housed at the Day's Inn and will continue there for the foreseeable future. The

guests are provided a hot meal each evening, but we have been ask to provide breakfast and lunch each day beginning January 25 thru 31st. There are funds from the Virginia Synod grant to help with the cost of the meals, however Grace needs volunteers to prepare breakfast and lunch and to deliver them to the Day's Inn. If you would be willing to take a day or partner with someone to help, please let Jerry or Gwen Kite know (540-910-0508). Both meals can be delivered in the morning. Breakfast can consist of frozen breakfast biscuits or individual boxes of cereal and milk and fruit. Each guest has access to a microwave to heat their meal. Lunch could be sandwiches or a bowl of chili, mac and cheese, or anything that can be reheated in the microwave. At this time there are 40 guests.



New Trees Need Water - We need three or four volunteers to water our new trees once per week. You could take the first week, for example, and water if there's no rain or snow scheduled (no need to water if it rains or snows, like this past week!). Let the Church Office or Pastor Paul know if you are interested.


