 negative of compassion without
 investment in relationship is that
 we give without expectation that

the person being helped will be any different, other than receiving help with an immediate need. *Investing relationally – which* takes TIME – allows us to move beyond merely the problem at hand, and involve the person, who has their own God-Given potential, to move beyond their cycle of need. Sometimes it is hard to know what to do. Do we keep giving (for example) gift cards to help every three months, or is there a way to move beyond that to ask "why," and maybe try other ways to offer a hand that helps others to use their potential to address their needs? To do this means we have to

6. To Achieve Transformation – not just in the lives of those we serve, but in our own lives as well. It is easy to judge those who face need and crisis, or to want to deal quickly with an immediate need ("fix it") rather than to serve more deeply, and be surprised by our own need, or to be surprised by how blessed we are when we share our blessings.

Our Wednesday Evening Community Suppers, I believe, start to get at the idea of Redemptive Compassion. What are we learning about people in our community who are homeless, or those who work faithfully but can't seem to make ends meet? Or from neighbors who join us who haven't really known a lot about us at Grace? At minimum, we are breaking bread with others who have value, and God-given gifts and potential, gifts we may not have! It makes us open to God's transformation of the world in, through, and with us!

All God's Children book group -

I attended Monday, September 25's All God's Children class, in which we viewed a video of the Rev. Cornel West, and writer Thomas Chatterton Williams. The theme of their

presentation centered around how we can move from our current fragmented society to a "Redemptive Culture." The conversation was an amazing one, and continually centered on the Cross of Jesus Christ, and His life on the way to the cross. One simple example is that Jesus spent time with people who were different from him, and offered compassion and love, even to the offer of his very self on the Cross. That's Redemptive! We invite all members and friends of Grace to sign up for Dinners of Eight – a time of fellowship and getting to know each other better as members of this family of faith.

How does Dinners of Eight work?

Each month, a group of eight people will gather at the home of a host family for food and fellowship. Groups can be made up of couples, single people, and/or families with kids.

The host(s) will provide the location and the main dish, the beverages, and appetizers if desired. The rest of the group will bring a dish to complete the meal – salad, bread, dessert, etc.

Each month the group will change; you won't be meeting with the same group every time you gather, nor at the same place. The purpose of Dinners of Eight is for us to have some relaxed time with different people from Grace. It's a way for us to deepen our connections with each other.

When does the Dinner of Eight happen?

It's up to the people who make up each month's group. Everyone may agree that Friday night is the best time; or Sunday afternoon; or Tuesday evening. The date and time each month doesn't matter, except that it's a day and time when everyone in the group can get together.



Uncertain about using a ramp, we offered a trial using Roll-A-Ramp purchased with Augusta Health Foundation grant funds.


Our ramp crew from Grace Lutheran, along with new friends from Christ Tabernacle, had fun working together to put in this ramp.

Grace ELC and WARM Cold Weather Shelter (CWS) -

We at Grace continue to be an important part of this community ministry headed by the Waynesboro Area Refuge Ministry. Last winter, we provided for our homeless neighbors for TWO WEEKS during the season and engaged several other churches and organizations to join us in "being Christ" to our neighbors - we provide food and shelter. What a wonderful experience!

This year, the CWS will be a bit different - attempting to simplify and expand our reach. Beginning the week of Thanksgiving and going through Christmas, WARM's goal is to provide beds/meals for up to 40 guests each night. After Christmas through Easter, the goal is to provide for up to 70 guests each night.

This year, Grace has been asked to host up to 20 guests the week of **December 4 - 11, 2023**. Volunteer opportunities include helping guests check-in, letting guests know when it's their time for a shower, providing/preparing/serving meals (dinner, breakfast and sack lunches), overnight hosts, and clean-up crew. It's a busy week and we will need your help!

We will begin collecting supplies in November: bathroom supplies (small soaps, shampoos, toothbrushes, toothpaste, combs) and food supplies (soft granola/snack bars, snacks, breakfast and lunch items).

We are also exploring if Grace is able to assist further - to provide/prepare/serve meals while the CWS is housed at EXPO - for up to 70 guests each night. Again, we will need your help.

Please pray for this important ministry as we move forward. And be on the lookout for more information - coming soon!
