In this time of Coronavirus, the "Order of Worship" that we use has changed. From the earliest years of the Church the order of Worship was to **GATHER**, bringing ourselves and all that we are before God; then to hear the **WORD** of God, letting it enter our lives with the expectation, as the prophet Isaiah tells us, that it will not come away empty, but accomplish succeed in that which God purposes for it. (Isaiah 55:10-11). We are hearing that word from (usually) two readings during this time of Coronavirus; the gospel, and one additional reading, either from the Old Testament, the Psalms, or an epistle reading. Then we hear the Word proclaimed through the Sermon. We confess our faith, we share in Prayers to God for the world we live in and in thanksgiving to God for the promises that we will not be alone in whatever we are going through. And we are thankful for God's Living Word, Jesus, the embodied Word of God, and the ways Jesus is revealed through the Old and New Testament. Then we are **SENT** into this world - perhaps the most important part of worship, even if the shortest - because it is then that we live out our faith proclaimed in Word and Worship.

MISSING from these weeks of physically distant worship is the **MEAL** and times to celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Baptism. As mentioned during our Maundy Thursday worship, we are in a wilderness time, where the promises of God we desire so greatly, to taste and drink and see God's forgiveness of sins and new life in bread and wine, in water, are still ahead of us. And as the apostle Paul wrote so powerfully in I Corinthians 11, we wait to receive the Sacrament together until ALL can receive it, not restricted by distance, and/or accessibility to technology that might allow some in the Body to receive it, and not others. So we pray for that time when we are re-united and able to receive the Meal together, and place our hope in the God who has called us through Water and the Word to bring us together again.



CROP Hunger Walk—Our lives have been upended in recent months with COVID-19. Out of an abundance of caution for the health and safety of walk participants, ENDING HUNGER ONE STEP AT A TIME \*\* the Waynesboro/East Augusta CROP Hunger Walk

will be a 'Virtual' event this year. You are invited to walk as an individual, with immediate family, or in small groups (up to ten people) walking a safe distance apart as part of a team. You can walk in your neighborhood, in a park – anyplace that feels safe. And even if you are not able to walk, you are welcome to "Walk in Spirit" and still raise money.

As previously announced in the bulletin and Grace Notes, the CROP Walk will be different this year due to the virus. It is suggested we walk in small groups or individually around our neighborhoods, the Greenway or the normal route. There is definitely a need for feeding the hungry both locally and globally during this pandemic. Let's make this the most successful **CROP Walk ever!** 

Grace Walkers and the CROP Walk- For nearly a year, some Grace members have been walking the Greenway on Thursday mornings. It has been a great way to have fellowship, build new friendships, get exercise and enjoy the beauty of nature on the Greenway. It has been especially helpful during this time of isolation due to coronavirus when we can't worship together as a congregation. We can social distance on these walks and still have fellowship. Some weeks we've had as many as 6 walkers and sometimes as few as 2 but there has been someone from Grace to walk with every week.





Child Care Needs for Students in School, and Grace - With

Waynesboro and other school districts beginning with Distance or Hybrid Learning, the need for Student care while parents are working has been great and immediate. Grace Council, at its August meeting, voted to work with the "C4" (YMCA, United Way, Community Foundation, Boys and Girls

Club) to provide space for this great need. ONE OF THE NEEDS REMAINING IS STAFFING, NOT ONLY AT GRACE, BUT AT OTHER FACILITIES AS WELL. Look for future announcements about volunteer needs as well.



Grace moves to a Narrative Lectionary in September - Our congregation joins with other congregations in the Southern Valley Conference of the Virginia Synod to begin using the Narrative Lectionary for the church year, provided by Luther Seminary of the ELCA. This lectionary uses one primary and one secondary passage each Sunday, and focuses on the full story of God's salvation and Grace found in the Bible. During the Fall we'll start with

passages from the Old Testament. In Advent, the prophets and the gospel point us to the Messiah, and from Christmas to Easter, we follow the gospel through from beginning to conclusion, from birth to resurrection. It's a way to allow us to follow the Gospel story in the way it is written and presented in the Bible. We'll begin using the lectionary **next Sunday**, **September 13th**.



Anti-Racism forums—A letter is in the process of being sent out to the congregation inviting you to take part in a discussion forum about the actions we at Grace can take together to show our support for our black brothers and sisters in Christ, as well as other people of color, and share our anti-racist stance in the community. Four forums are planned in September; we hope for your participation!



Food Pantries - Thanks, and Continuing Need—Many thanks to those who have donated Peanut Butter, Mac 'n Cheese, Personal Hygiene items, and Dried Rice and Beans to our local food banks. We have made **seven** United Methodist, and three to Calvary United Methodist, Stuarts Draft, with the donations gratefully received in the midst of great need. If you can help, please donate to our box set inside the office door for you to drop off.

A Note about Prayer and our Prayer List - Often when we think about Prayer - or Prayer Lists - the people or places we include in prayer are those we are concerned about, or those we know are in need. At the same time, we know that Prayer can include celebrations and joys. And also that Prayers can - and should - be offered for one another in daily life. On our Prayer List

(page 12), there are various categories in which we separate cares and concerns for members from celebrations and thanksgivings, and then there are Needs in our World, and prayers for the Church, which has included a prayer for the neighborhoods near our church and those we live in. We will create a new category, **Our Neighbors**, and note that when we pray (currently, for example) for Club Court and Berkeley Glenn neighborhoods, we are asking for God's blessing on our neighbors, not necessarily out of any crisis or problem. All of our lives and all we do, and where we live, are under God's Grace! We pray not only when things are bad, or good, but perhaps most importantly, when we are simply in the midst of living.

During this time of Coronavirus, we want to be sure that you are able to receive **Christ in Our Home** daily devotion booklets. If you are not familiar with them, they are a booklet with a daily scripture reading, devotion and prayer that help to develop a good discipline of faith in daily life, seeking God's Word to help and guide us in whatever comes our way as followers of Christ in this world.
