Welcome to Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church! There are four key parts to our Worship Service: we GATHER

before our God to prepare to worship, and bring ourselves and all that we are before God. Then we hear the **WORD** of God; we share the four Bible Readings with at least one billion other Christians around the world each Sunday! And we hear that word proclaimed through the Sermon, confess our faith in the God whose Grace we hear about in the Word, and offer our prayers to God, for the sake of the Church, the World, and each other in our needs and joys. We then share in the **MEAL** of Holy Communion, offering ourselves and what we have to God, and then discovering God's love and forgiveness as we receive Christ's Body and Blood through the bread and wine. Finally we are **SENT**, the shortest but perhaps most important part of worship, because it is THEN that we live out our Faith and what we believe about God's Grace and Love, and how it makes <u>us</u> a blessing in this world as we share it.

During worship, you'll notice parts of the service in regular type, which are spoken/prayed by various worship leaders. Then there are parts the you and the rest of the congregation respond and/or pray in **bold type**. All of us are participants as we worship God! When asked to **stand**, please do so <u>as you are able</u>. As Jesus welcomed all in the crowds who gathered around him, so he welcomes us.



Fourth Sunday of Advent



What has come into being ⁴in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. ⁵The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

⁶There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. ⁸He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. ⁹The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. ¹⁰He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. ¹¹He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. ¹²But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, ¹³who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God.

It is God the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known.

The Holy Communion


The congregation may be seated.

OUR LORD BIDS YOU WELCOME TO THIS HOLY MEAL! At the table of our Lord Jesus Christ, God nourishes faith, forgives sin, and calls us to be witnesses to the Gospel. Here we receive Christ's body and blood and God's gifts of forgiveness of sin, life, and salvation to be received by faith for the strengthening of faith. In this sacrament the crucified and risen Christ is present, giving his true body and blood as food and drink. This real presence is a mystery. Admission to the Sacrament is by invitation of the Lord — regardless of Church denomination — to those who are baptized. (Taken from the ELCA statement on worship. The Use and Means of Grace ©1997)

Communion Distribution: One communion team will serve the left side of the nave; another team will serve those on the right. You are invited to come to the altar by the center aisle; take an empty individual glass (or filled grape juice glass) available at the railing, and proceed to the railing, filling in from the center out toward the side aisle. As you receive the bread and wine, you may respond as follows:

The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you.

Amen.

Welcome to Worship! We gather in praise, we hear a living Word from our God, and God nourishes us at the Table so we can go forth as Ambassadors, as Salt and Light, wherever we are! Please remember the following as we continue to worship and *bear with one another* with care and Christian friendship during Covid:

- We continue to mask during worship
- Fellowship is a blessing of our time together! Remember social distancing, and take good conversations outside.
- Smart phones are a marvel of our time! Please check your phone before worship and mute, silence or turn your phone off before the service begins.

Congregation Meeting today immediately after Worship:

There will be a called Congregation Meeting for the purpose of reviewing - and voting on - the 2022 Spending Plan/Budget for Grace. Your participation is very important, since all matters of God's Mission for us, including a Church budget and its approval, are a part of being a Community of Servants Sharing in the Word and Work of Jesus!

Christmas Eve Decorating After Worship! We'll be setting up a Christmas tree, putting up greens, getting candles in place on pews, walls, and altar area! Can you help? Stay after the congregation meeting, and pitch in! And thanks!

Advent Vespers In Person on Wednesday Evenings – We join with our sister congregations in the area under the theme: <u>Holy</u> <u>Darkness</u>. While *darkness* can often have a negative connotation, as the absence of light, or as an opposition to goodness, God's Word often points to the Glory of God being found in the darkness. Think of Nicodemus visiting with Jesus and hearing Jesus tell how God so loved the World...or of Christmas <u>Eve</u> and the shepherds discovering in the night sky the Good News of Jesus' birth. We ponder the presence of God in the darkness of our worship at our area Lutheran Churches Wednesdays in Lent at 7:00 p.m.:

December 22nd at Grace – *Darkness Holds God* – Masking is required. Grace offers its worship Live via Grace's YouTube channel, or by telephone via Zoom (audio).





Sign-Up for Christmas Eve Worship Today! – Grace will offer three services on Christmas Eve. December 24th. Because of ustmas eve at each service to 80 persons sitting in the congregation (not including soloists musicipate at a congregation (not lingering concerns of the Coronavirus we are limiting attendance including soloists, musicians, etc.). Find the Sign-Up Sheet in the Narthex at Grace or call Nancy at the Church Office. We ask that you SIGN-UP for one of the following services, all held in the main worship space at Grace:

- 3:00 p.m. Christmas Eve We will "create the manger scene," with lessons read by families, carols sung joyfully, special music, Holy Communion, and Silent Night sung by Candlelight.
- 5:00 p.m. Christmas Eve FULL
- 9:00 p.m. Christmas Eve A traditional Christmas Eve liturgy of Holy Communion, filled with carols, special music, Holy Communion and Silent Night sung by Candlelight.

Holy Communion at Grace—We have returned to a more "active" form of Holy Communion:

- Ushers will invite communicants by row to come down the center aisle, safely distanced.
- The Communicant will receive the bread (the body of Christ) from the Pastor, who will be masked.
- The Communicant will pick up a pre-filled cup of wine or grape juice from the trays, and hear the pronouncement of "the blood of Christ" from the (masked) worship assistant located on the other side of the communion rail.
- The Communicant will then put their glass in another tray located further down the aisle, and return to their seat via the side aisle.
- Those unable to come forward will have Communion brought to them by the Pastor and communion assistant.

In addition to participating more fully in Holy Communion, this will reduce the plastic waste from the use of chalices-or more recently, the bags and containers-used in Holy Communion.





Giving envelopes for 2022 are available in the Nave. Please pick them up or contact the church office to have them mailed to you. In an effort to reduce waste, we did not get envelopes for those who have been giving electronically. And, as a result, many giving numbers have changed this year and not everyone will receive envelopes. If you have any questions, etc., please contact the church office.



Holy Communion Chalices remain available from the Church Office - Call the Church Office in order to pick up Communion Chalices for Sunday worship if you are watching via You Tube or Zoom.



Lutheran Disaster Response is on the ground in Tornado stricken states. The reputation of LDR is they (we!) remain until the response to survivors is complete. Make check payable to Grace and put "LDR/Tornado" in the memo line.



Prayer Group on Wednesdays starting in January - Grace will offer a regular Prayer Group on Wednesday mornings beginning in January at 10:00 a.m. in the Chapel. We will begin each time with an abbreviated Morning Prayer worship, and conclude with Prayers offered by all participants: for the World, for the Church and its Mission of the Gospel; for Creation, for Peace and Justice among the Nations, for those who are sick, poor, grieving, lonely; for Grace church, and for special concerns. You are invited to Prayer!



Grace Office Hours to Change starting January 2022:

Beginning January 1, 2022, Grace's Office Hours will be Monday through Thursday, from 8:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., with Nancy taking lunch from 11:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. The office will then be CLOSED on Fridays. This extends office hours by 1/2 hour Monday through Thursday.



Yoga Class Offered at Grace - Shelton Sprouse, who had the "Blue Moon Yoga" studio on Main Street until the pandemic, is offering a Yoga class Saturday mornings at Grace. It is designed for beginners and senior adults, for "physical activity and mindfulness." The class is offered at 11:00 a.m. - 12:15 a.m. Saturday mornings, in the Fellowship Hall. A donation may be given, but is not required. Classes will begin in earnest starting January 8th.



Psalms added to the Daily Lectionary - Each week in the bulletin is a set of readings designed to allow people to read through the Bible in two years. After our Bible study on the Psalms (finished in November), we are including Psalms for those who wish to pray the Psalms as a part of their everyday discipline (see page 24). There is a Psalm for the morning, and one for the evening. *Whether you read all the readings, or choose one reading, or only pray the Psalms, being daily in the Word of God is a great discipline and aid to faith. If you don't have a daily discipline in the Word, Advent is a great time to start!*



Disciple's Kitchen Christmas Gifts—Thank you for your donations of shampoo and deodorant that Grace collected for the Disciple's Kitchen program to use as part of their Christmas gift bags. We were able to provide items for 45 men and 14 women.



Food Pantries - Thanks, and Continuing Need—Many thanks to those who have donated Peanut Butter, Mac 'n Cheese, Personal Hygiene items, and Dried Rice and Beans to our local food banks. We have made <u>twenty-three</u> deliveries thus far, ten to Main Street United Methodist, and thirteen to Calvary United Methodist, Stuarts Draft, with the donations gratefully received in the midst of great need. Overall, we have given well over a TON of food! If you can help, please donate to our box set inside the office door for you to drop off.
