#### **Nicene Creed**





## **Thanksgiving at the Table**

#### **The Holy Communion**

OUR LORD BIDS YOU WELCOME TO THIS HOLY MEAL! At the table of our Lord Jesus Christ, God nourishes faith, forgives sin, and calls us to be witnesses to the Gospel. Here we receive Christ's body and blood and God's gifts of forgiveness of sin, life, and salvation to be received by faith for the strengthening of faith. In this sacrament the crucified and risen Christ is present, giving his true body and blood as food and drink. This real presence is a mystery. 





- January 8<sup>th</sup> We will conclude our discussion of US: The Resurrection of American Terror by Kenneth W. Wheeler, covering Chapters 9-10 and the Afterword. The author is a Black ELCA pastor who takes us through his
- seven-decade-long journey that lays bare the terror of being Black in America. The book offers a deeply vulnerable and piercing portrait of the human toll of white supremacy and points to the Cross as a place of hope and reconciliation.
- January 22<sup>nd</sup> Start discussion of A Fever in the Heartland The Ku Klux Klan's Plot to Take Over America, and the Woman Who Stopped Them by Timothy Egan. Donations for Nicaragua Mission Trip—Our friends and partners at CICRIN, the Nicaraguan Christian Children's Center and School (www.cicrinus.org), have invited our mission team to bring certain items they need. Our airline baggage allowance this year enables us to respond positively to their request.

Here's what we are collecting in the box in the narthex.

- Children's and adult cough, cold, and flu medications (no liquids, please; tablets, pills and powders only)
- Children's and adult vitamins
- Pens, acrylic and permanent markers, colored paper, glue, color pencils, (things for office and school)
- New underwear for boys (8-15 years old) and girls (8-13 years old)
- Used but working laptop computers and portable tablets are useful for kids learning computation skills and/or headed off to university
