

First Reading: Acts 2:1-21

A reading from Acts:

¹When the day of Pentecost had come, [the apostles] were all together in one place. ²And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

⁵Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. ⁶And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. ⁷Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? ⁹Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, ¹¹Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." ¹²All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" ¹³But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."

19 And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist.

OUR LORD BIDS YOU WELCOME TO THIS HOLY MEAL! At the table of our Lord Jesus Christ, God nourishes faith, forgives sin, and calls us to be witnesses to the Gospel. Here we receive Christ's body and blood and God's gifts of forgiveness of sin, life, and salvation to be received by faith for the strengthening of faith. In this sacrament the crucified and risen Christ is present, giving his true body and blood as food and drink. This real presence is a mystery. Admission to the Sacrament is by invitation of the Lord — regardless of Church denomination — to those who are baptized. (Taken from the ELCA statement on worship. The Use and Means of Grace ©1997)

Communion Distribution: One communion team will serve the left side of the nave; another team will serve those on the right. You are invited to come to the altar by the center aisle; take an empty individual glass (or filled grape juice glass) available at the railing, and proceed to the railing, filling in from the center out toward the side aisle. As you receive the bread and wine, you may respond as follows:

The body of Christ, given for you.

The blood of Christ, shed for you.

Amen.

Our "Ongoing Need for Prayer for Relatives/Friends" — A continuing part of our Prayers during worship involves our prayer for relatives and friends, as well as for Grace members. We know the importance of continued prayer, especially as those we love and care for face longer term illness and recoveries. We also want to be sure that we can continue to add the names of all friends and relatives who are in need of prayer, and include this list during Sunday prayer. Therefore, we will begin a new policy of keeping "Ongoing Needs for Prayer" for three (3) months, and then removing the names (unless by request for names to remain on the list longer).



Grace on the "ground floor" - Grace has been working with other local congregations to establish an Assistance Ministry that helps all Waynesboro congregations to pool their resources to

- Better help local people and families in crisis with rent and other assistance
- Have one place where people in need can go, rather than "shop" all the churches
- Establish a datebase so as many people as possible are helped, with no duplication of services
- Offer casework services to families so they can receive the help they need to move from living in crisis to functional living more able to focus on children and the more routine challenges of daily life.

Grace Council on May 16th approved our congregation as a "charter member" of this Assistance Ministry. We will be a part of putting together the policies on how the fund is used. Currently approximately 10 other congregations have expressed interest, with the hope that we continue to grow the number of participating churches. Please pray for this Ministry, and getting it up and running as soon as possible, as the need is great!



The **All God's Children Anti-Racism Book Group** is taking the summer off! Our last meeting will be on **Monday**, **June 5**th at 7:00 pm in the Grace conference room. We will discuss chapters IV (Hate) and V (Love) of *Jesus and the Disinherited* by Howard Thurman.

We will resume meeting on the 2nd and 4th Mondays of every month (same time, same place) on **Monday**, **September 11th** and discuss Tony Morrison's only short story, *Recitatif* (including the 2022 Introduction by Zadie Smith).

Through the summer, members are asked to preview potential sources for future discussions and experiences. These can include books, articles, events, movies, programs, web- or podcasts, field trips, guest speakers or anything that deepens our understanding of racial equity and justice in the world. We plan to map out an agenda for the next year at the September 11th meeting.

School Backpack Ministry—The food backpack program for 2022-2023 school year finished on May 17th. Grace members have helped pack the food bags twice a month. Grace and St. John's Catholic work together on this ministry packing food for William Perry and Wenonah Elementary Schools. Approximately 4,500 bags of food have been packed this year. A food bag is sent home with some students each Friday. The bags contain a variety of foods such as peanut butter, cereal, canned beans, fruits, peas, carrots, dried beans, rice and canned tuna or chicken. Each week the students receive at least 6 items in the bag. Thank you to the many volunteers from Grace who help with this ministry.



Food Pantries - Thanks, and Continuing Need—Many thanks to those who have donated Peanut Butter, Mac 'n Cheese, Personal Hygiene items, and Dried Rice and Beans to our local food pantries. We have made thirty-three deliveries thus far, fifteen to Main Street United Methodist, and eighteen to Calvary United Methodist, Stuarts Draft, with the donations gratefully received in the midst of great need. Overall, we have given well over 3,570 pounds of food! If you can help, please donate to our box set inside the office door for you to drop off.

Hiker Ministry May 22 – June 17

We serve Appalachian Trail through-hikers through the "bubble" of time when they are going through our area from Georgia, heading to Maine, providing showers, a warm, dry, safe place to sleep, breakfast and snacks, and a Thursday evening dinner.

Needs:

- Snacks and breakfast foods particularly cereals, bread, fresh fruit, ice cream, cookies, etc. They can be left in the kitchen area of the Youth Room or at the back of the sanctuary on Sundays.
- 2. **Thursday evening dinners** small groups of Grace members or community provide a dinner for hikers each Thursday while hikers are here.
- 3. Volunteers to staff while hikers are here. We are open from 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 a.m. each day during that time except for Saturdays and Sundays. While we have volunteer coordinators who are on duty each day/night, volunteers from Grace and friends are needed to help with check-in each evening, staying overnight, and helping with check-out each morning. These are not difficult jobs and involve mostly greeting and orienting hikers as they come in to stay the night, showing them the ropes and rules, and supporting whatever needs they might have. Please check the calendar on the table as you enter the sanctuary to see where volunteers are needed and to see the responsibilities.

We ask for two volunteers for each shift, so you do not need to do this alone. The "shifts" are as follows:

- Check-in 5 8 p.m.
- Overnight 8 p.m. 7 a.m. (and we provide comfy cots in a private Sunday School room, so you do not need to stay awake all night – the hikers usually go to bed pretty early too!)
- Check out 7 9 a.m.

The benefits include getting to know hikers from all over the United States and the world! We've had hikers stay with us who were from Canada, Israel, Australia, Germany, the United Kingdom, Japan, South Africa and many other countries. They are often on a personal journey of growth and healing and you can be a part of their journey and their story.
