[Moses said:] ¹⁵The LORD your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among your own people; you shall heed such a prophet. ¹⁶This is what you requested of the LORD your God at Horeb on the day of the assembly when you said: "If I hear the voice of the LORD my God any more, or ever again see this great fire, I will die." ¹⁷Then the LORD replied to me: "They are right in what they have said. ¹⁸I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their own people; I will put my words in the mouth of the prophet, who shall speak to them everything that I command. ¹⁹Anyone who does not heed the words that the prophet shall speak in my name, I myself will hold accountable. ²⁰But any prophet who speaks in the name of other gods, or who presumes to speak in my name a word that I have not commanded the prophet to speak — that prophet shall die."

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 8:1-13

A reading from 1 Corinthians:

¹Now concerning food sacrificed to idols: we know that "all of us possess knowledge." Knowledge puffs up, but love builds up. ²Anyone who claims to know something does not yet have the necessary knowledge; ³but anyone who loves God is known by him.



⁴Hence, as to the eating of food offered to idols, we know that "no idol in the world really exists," and that "there is no God but one." ⁵Indeed, even though there may be so-called gods in heaven or on earth — as in fact there are many gods and many lords — ⁶yet for us there is one God, the Father, from whom are all things and for whom we exist, and one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are all things and through whom we exist.

⁷It is not everyone, however, who has this knowledge. Since some have become so accustomed to idols until now, they still think of the food they eat as food offered to an idol; and their conscience, being weak, is defiled. ⁸Food will not bring us close to God. We are no worse off if we do not eat, and no better off if we do. ⁹But take care that this liberty of yours does not somehow become a stumbling block to the weak. ¹⁰For if others see you, who possess knowledge, eating in the temple of an idol, might they not, since their conscience is weak, be encouraged to the point of eating food sacrificed to idols? ¹¹So by your knowledge those weak believers for whom Christ died are destroyed. ¹²But when you thus sin against members of your family, and wound their conscience when it is weak, you sin against Christ. ¹³Therefore, if food is a cause of their falling, I will never eat meat, so that I may not cause one of them to fall.

The Holy Communion

OUR LORD BIDS YOU WELCOME TO THIS HOLY MEAL! At the table of our Lord Jesus Christ, God nourishes faith, forgives sin, and calls us to be witnesses to the Gospel. Here we receive Christ's body and blood and God's gifts of forgiveness of sin, life, and salvation to be received by faith for the strengthening of faith. In this sacrament the crucified and risen Christ is present, giving his true body and blood as food and drink. This real presence is a mystery. Admission to the Sacrament is by invitation of the Lord — regardless of Church denomination — to those who are baptized. (Taken from the ELCA statement on worship. The Use and Means of Grace ©1997)

Ushers will invite you to come down the center aisle. Receive the bread from the pastor or assisting minister, then turn to the side you have sat on, and receive the wine/grape juice from the communion assistant at the altar rail. Place your empty cup in the trays at the end of the railing, and return to your pew via the side aisle.

The body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ strengthen you and keep you in his grace. **Amen**





Words You Don't Want to Say, but We Must! Those words are *COVID*, *flu*, *RSV and Winter Viruses*. We've had a number of members who have been sick in recent days and weeks. We are coming into a time when Health experts tell us to expect more cases. With this in mind please note the following:

- 1. If you have any symptoms, or have tested positive, please stay at home. YouTube worship services are available Live every Sunday for those who are sick.
- 2. If you have COVID, flu, fever or aches, please wait until you test negative usually 5-10 days or until symptoms end until you return to worship.

All God's Children meets on the 2nd and 4th Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. in the Grace conference room. Our January agenda includes the following:

Starting February 12th, we begin discussion of A Fever in the Heartland – The Ku Klux Klan's Plot to Take Over America, and the Woman Who Stopped Them by Timothy Egan. The next book is a historical thriller by a Pulitzer and National Book Award-winning author that tells the riveting story of the Ku Klux Klan's rise to power in the 1920s, the cunning con man who drove that rise, and the woman who stopped them. A Fever in the Heartland is compelling, powerful, and profoundly resonant today. The book marries a propulsive drama to a powerful reckoning with one of the darkest threads in American history.

For several weeks, we have requested donations for the mission trip to Nicaragua. Mark and Tami Radecke were preparing to lead a group of 16, including seven members of Grace. Unfortunately, we received some sad and shocking news this week that the Children's Center, CICRIN, has been seized by the Nicaraguan government. Locks have been placed on the front gates and CICRIN is no longer in operation. Therefore, **the mission trip has been cancelled**. CICRIN is one of 3,500 non-governmental organizations closed and seized by the Nicaraguan government in the last several years.

The Director of the Children's Center, Hellen Vindas, and her daughter were asked to leave immediately, and they are living in a partially built home on the island with no electricity, toilets, drinking water or an exterior door. She is out of work after a 33-year career with CICRIN.

After learning the news of CICRIN's closure, several members of the team decided that our monies would be better spent helping Hellen to finish her home. This would also allow her to employ local people who have lost work due to the closing of CICRIN. Pastor Paul and Ron Almarode have graciously offered for Grace to be the conduit for these donations to support Hellen and her family.

People have asked what will happen to the children at CICRIN. The school will continue to be run by the Nicaraguan government. However, the public school system is not providing the necessary preparation for youth entering college or the workforce, which is why Hellen founded the CICRIN school. The children living in residence at CICRIN are those who were most at risk of abuse and neglect when living with their family of origin. They are staying with church families right now and their long-term housing situation is unknown.

Thank you for your prayers and financial contributions for the mission trip. If you donated items such as children's vitamins, cold medicine or underwear, please feel free to take those items. We will donate what is left to a local shelter such as WARM or Valley Mission.

We ask for your prayers for Hellen Vindas and her family, the workers at CICRIN who are now unemployed in an impoverished place with little opportunity to secure income, and for the children who lived and went to school at CICRIN. If you are interested in learning more, please contact Mark or Tami Radecke.
