- Clean-up Team: light cleaning duties. WARM will have guests complete basic chores (sweeping, mopping if needed, removing garbage). We will come in during the day (after the guests are gone,) to check the area, follow-up as needed Lysol bathrooms, showers; wash/dry/fold towels.




