The Holy Communion

OUR LORD BIDS YOU WELCOME TO THIS HOLY MEAL! At the table of our Lord Jesus Christ, God nourishes faith, forgives sin, and calls us to be witnesses to the Gospel. Here we receive Christ's body and blood and God's gifts of forgiveness of sin, life, and salvation to be received by faith for the strengthening of faith. In this sacrament the crucified and risen Christ is present, giving his true body and blood as food and drink. This real presence is a mystery. Admission to the Sacrament is by invitation of the Lord — regardless of Church denomination — to those who are baptized. (Taken from the ELCA statement on worship. The Use and Means of Grace ©1997)

Ushers will invite you to come down the center aisle. Receive the bread from the pastor or assisting minister, then turn to the side you have sat on, and receive the wine/grape juice from the communion assistant at the altar rail. Place your empty cup in the trays at the end of the railing, and return to your pew via the side aisle.

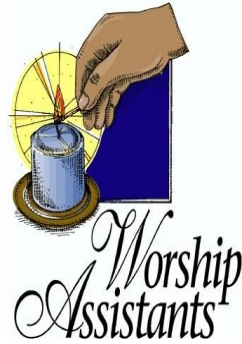

Food Pantry Collections: A huge thanks to everyone as you continue to bring food for the food bank box near the office. To date, we have collected over **4,210** pounds of food (we have made **forty** deliveries, seventeen to Main Street United Methodist, and twenty-three to Calvary United Methodist, Stuarts Draft).

At a First Sunday Fellowship in February, we heard a presentation from Adrienne and A. J. Young on the River City Bread Basket/ Lifeworks Project. This is a place for people who may not meet the qualifications for services to receive free food. Their goal is to serve everyone who enters the doors and those in Waynesboro's East End who are in walking distance to the pantry.

On Saturday, March 2, several Grace members toured the Bread Basket across from Christ Tabernacle. Several things that they don't receive often from donations or the food bank include condiments, such mayonnaise, mustard, catsup and salad dressings. Small sizes of these items are requested. We would like to add these to our food collection. There will be a box near the existing food box in the church office hallway for these items



Synod Assembly is in April - Online! - The Virginia Synod Assembly is a yearly event in which we learn about the Ministry of our Synod. We also learn about the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and tend to necessary business - such as electing delegates to the ELCA Churchwide Assembly in 2025. *We need two (2) delegates to attend the four-hour, completely ONLINE Assembly being held Saturday, April 27th.* Please let Pastor, Council President Robin Crowder, or the Church Office know if you are interested, or would like more information.

Holy Week

Palm Sunday, March 24th, 10:15am - Ecumenical Gathering on Grace's Front Lawn - *This year after we process and continue worship at Grace, we will NOT have the Passion Reading, inviting you to experience the journey to the cross through Mark's Passion of Jesus on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday.*

Maundy Thursday – We join the disciples and Jesus in the upper room; Holy Communion, and Forgiveness are a part of worship on this first worship service of the Great Three Days, as is the Stripping of the Altar. **10:00 a.m. in the Chapel, 7:00 p.m. in the Worship Space.**

Good Friday – It is here that we hear the Passion of our Lord in its fullness. This year, *Pastor Mark Radecke* shares his gift of telling Mark's Gospel story of Jesus' Passion from memory. This powerful telling, and our prayers before the Cross, lead us to the heart of our Salvation story. **7:00 p.m. in the Worship Space.**

Easter Vigil – Meeting at sundown, which is traditionally the beginning of the new day in the Hebrew tradition, we tell stories of God's deliverance and salvation. And then we discover that God's deliverance and salvation is not only historical, but present today in the crucified and risen Jesus! **7:00 p.m. in front of Grace!**

Easter, the Resurrection of our Lord, is Sunday, March 31st. There are **three (3)** opportunities to celebrate the Resurrection:

Christ Tabernacle Church of God in Christ has welcomed us to a **Easter Sunrise Service** on the front lawn of Fairfax Hall, across from their church building. We'll meet at **6:45am** to greet the dawning of our salvation!







We enjoy **Easter Breakfast** together between the services – fellowship and joy together on this Day of Days!

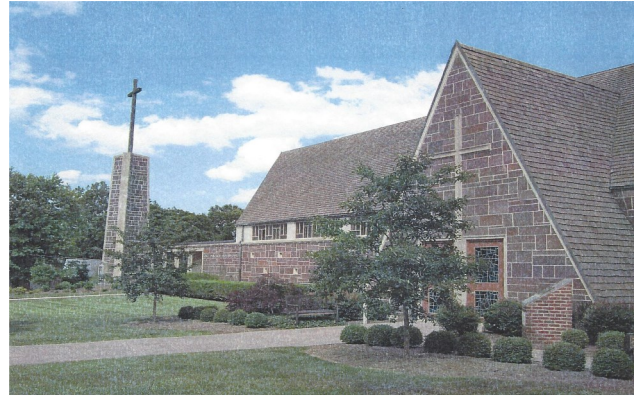

Tower Cross at Grace - Wednesday, March 20th, during the time of high winds in our area, the Cross fell from the top of the Grace Tower, and crashed into the Columbarium area. The 20+ foot cross grazed the portico over the Office Entrance, did heavy damage to the Unused portion of the Columbarium, and grazed the current Columbarium, doing light damage. *No cremains or resting places were dis-interred or overly disturbed* We were fortunate no-one was near the place where the cross hit, and that there was no greater damage. Thanks to our Property Committee and Ron Almarode for working with Insurance and beginning the process of repair. We will once again Lift High the Cross to celebrate God's Grace *at Grace!*
